Cherry Point, Outlying Fields and Ranges Training

MARINE CORPS AIR STATION CHERRY POINT, N.C. (Sept. 7, 2022) —Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point and its outlying fields will have various units using the range areas for training and conducting operations into the evening and late night throughout September.

Residents can expect to see heightened military training and aviation activity at Marine Corps Outlying Field (MCOLF) Atlantic and Auxiliary Landing Field (MCALF) Bogue. Residents in proximity to MCOLF Atlantic can expect noise common to rotary-wing aircraft, and increased military vehicle traffic for about two weeks, starting about Sept. 12, with training taking place as late as midnight in some occurrences.

Residents near MCALF Bogue can expect flight operations being conducted through the evening, as late as 8 p.m., on or about Sept. 13-15 and Sept. 28-30.

Additionally, residents living on the air station and in proximity to MCAS Cherry Point may hear the occasional explosion from Explosive Ordnance Disposal Marines conducting routine training.
