Subj: CONTROL OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

1. Situation. This Order publishes supplemental regulations relating to alcoholic beverages applicable to all personnel within the limits of Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Cherry Point.

2. Cancellation. ASO 1746.2A w/Ch 1.

3. Mission. To ensure the lawful sale, dispensing, possession, consumption, and transportation of alcoholic beverages per Federal, State, and local laws or regulations.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. To ensure all military personnel, family members, and DoD civilians are aware of the laws and regulations concerning the sale, dispensing, possession, consumption, and transportation of alcoholic beverages aboard MCAS Cherry Point.

(2) Concept of Operations. Commanding Officers, the Provost Marshal, and the Director, Marine Corps Community Services (MCCS) will ensure military personnel, family members, MCCS employees in activities that sell alcoholic beverages, and DoD civilians are informed and held accountable for violations of this Order.

(a) Alcoholic beverages include any beverage containing at least one half of one percent (0.5 percent) alcohol by volume, including malt beverages, unfortified wines, fortified spirituous liquors, and mixed beverages. Beverages containing less than one half of one percent (0.5 percent) alcohol by volume are considered, for the purposes of this Order, to be nonalcoholic beverages.

(b) The minimum legal drinking age (MLDA) is 21 years of age. It is prohibited for any person to knowingly sell or give alcoholic beverages to anyone less than the MLDA. No activity engaged in the dispensing of alcoholic beverages will employ or assign persons under the MLDA to dispense alcoholic beverages.

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(c) It is prohibited for any person less than the MLDA to purchase, possess, or consume alcoholic beverages. It is prohibited for any person to use or attempt to use a driver's license or other identification issued to another person or an altered form of identification to obtain alcoholic beverages. In addition to any other penalty imposed by this Order and per reference (f), violation of this provision shall be grounds for revocation of driving privileges for one year (mandatory) or until the age of 21 (discretionary).

(d) It is prohibited for any person to permit the use of his/her driver's license by any other person to violate or attempt to violate the provisions of this Order.

(e) All persons engaged in dispensing alcoholic beverages will have the responsibility for determining whether a customer is above the MLDA per established positive identification procedures. This determination will be made at the time of sale.

(f) Any person or facility that inadvertently sells or dispenses alcoholic beverages to a person discovered to be under the MLDA shall immediately attempt to recover the alcoholic beverages and notify the Provost Marshal's Office in all cases.

(g) All persons and activities are prohibited from engaging in the sale of alcoholic beverages, except the following MCCS activities:

1. Package Stores.
2. Service Stations.
3. Convenience Stores.

(h) The sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages by the drink is authorized at the following MCCS activities. Additional MCCS activities may be granted authorization by the Installation Commander or Secretary of the Navy as required by reference (d).

1. Miller's Landing Complex.
2. BOQ Recreational Area/~~The Shrine~~. *Neuse Room.*
3. Golf Course ~~Snack Bar~~. *Pro Shop.*
4. Roadhouse Complex.
5. Two Rivers Theater and Event Center.
6. MCCS/Command sponsored events.
7. Hancock Creek Lodge.

(i) The possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages on government owned boats is not authorized. Possession or consumption is authorized for passengers in privately owned boats, but is not authorized for the operator of the boat.

(j) No person will sell, dispense, or furnish alcoholic beverages to any person who is in an intoxicated condition.

(k) The consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited during the time a person is in a duty status and during the period eight hours prior thereto. Duty status includes not only duty performed during normal working hours, but also any official duty performed outside normal working hours, such as duty section, guard duty, flight duty, operations duty, or any other specifically assigned duties.

(l) All persons making purchases of alcoholic beverages at package sales or bulk sales stores are prohibited from using said purchases for the purpose of resale or barter.

(m) It is the responsibility of those activities selling or dispensing alcoholic beverages to establish positive identification procedures for all persons making such purchases. Employees will be cautioned that noncompliance with this Order may lead to disciplinary action including dismissal. The employee concerned will be afforded administrative due process and shall be granted all substantial rights as required by law.

(n) Per reference (b), the possession and consumption of reasonable amounts of alcoholic beverages is authorized in quarters.

(o) Possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages in designated picnic pavilions in and around bachelor enlisted quarters may be authorized by unit commanders on infrequent, non-routine occasions when an entire squadron, as a group, marks at MCAS Cherry Point, a uniquely military occasion such as the conclusion of a deployment, hail and farewells, or in connection with the Marine Corps Birthday Ball.

(p) Possession/Transportation/Prohibitions

1. Open Containers Outside Designated Areas. No individual shall possess any bottle, can, or other receptacle containing any alcoholic beverage (that has been opened, or its seal broken) in places not authorized in this Order and under the conditions set herein.

2. Consumption in Motor Vehicles. Consumption of any alcoholic beverage in a motor vehicle aboard MCAS Cherry Point is prohibited.

3. Transport of Open Containers. Transportation of any open alcoholic beverage in the passenger area of a motor vehicle aboard MCAS Cherry Point is prohibited.

4. Transport of Alcoholic Beverages in Government Vehicles. No individual will transport, or cause to be transported in a government owned vehicle, alcoholic beverages, except on order of a unit commander for unit functions or MCCS employees in the performance of their duties.

5. Transport of Alcoholic Beverages in Government Aircraft. Individuals will only be permitted to transport alcohol upon approval by the Aircraft Commander and when in compliance with references (a) and (b).

(q) Bulk Sales Activities will Prominently Post a Notice as Follows:

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1. "IT'S THE LAW, IT'S AN ORDER. North Carolina, South Carolina, and Virginia have container laws that are strictly enforced by State authorities. ASO 1746.2B prohibits the possession and transport of any open alcoholic beverage in the passenger area of any motor vehicle. No alcoholic beverage may be transported in the passenger area of a motor vehicle unless unopened and in the manufacturer's original sealed container. Consumption of any alcoholic beverage in a motor vehicle is strictly prohibited."

2. Violations are punishable under Article 92 of the UCMJ. Violations by civilians will be referred to the Special Assistant United States Attorney for prosecution under Title 18, U.S. Code, section 13 in Federal court. Any violation is grounds for administrative suspension or revocation of driving privileges for a minimum of 12 months or a period imposed by State Authorities.

(r) Confiscation. Any alcoholic beverage taken from the possession of any person who violates this Order will be immediately sealed and tagged with the name of the person or persons from whom taken, the time, date, and a list of witnesses who can identify same. The alcoholic beverage will be secured until articles have served their purpose as evidence. When alcoholic beverages are seized on the grounds that they are possessed in an unauthorized manner, military authorities may maintain possession over the lawfully seized beverages through the conclusion of any legal or administrative proceeding.

(s) Waiver of Legal Drinking Age

1. Per reference (d), the Installation Commander may waive the required drinking age of 21 but not set it below the age of 18, if determined that the exception is justified by special circumstances. Waiver requests could encompass but are not limited to infrequent, non-routine military occasions when the entire unit, as a group, marks at a military installation a uniquely military occasion, such as the conclusion of arduous military service or the anniversary of special occasions. Requests shall be submitted in writing to the Commanding Officer, MCAS Cherry Point (Attn: Station Adjutant).

2. The event must be held on MCAS Cherry Point. The Unit Commander must ensure that appropriate operational risk management and appropriate controls are in place to prevent endangering military service members or the surrounding community.

3. The limited, case-by-case approval to consume alcohol at age 18 is a privilege, not a right.

b. Coordinating Instructions. Commanding Officers/Officers in Charge shall:

(1) Establish maximum reasonable quantities of alcoholic beverages authorized for Bachelor Enlisted Quarters under their jurisdiction.

(2) Ensure personnel are aware of the provisions of this Order, the importance of responsible use of alcoholic beverages, and possible repercussions for violations per this Order.

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5. Administration and Logistics.


a. Questions pertaining to the content of this order should be directed to MCCS, MCAS Cherry Point.

b. This Order is punitive in nature. Violations are punishable under Article 92 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ). For civilians, to include Department of Defense (DoD) civilian personnel, violations may result in civilian criminal prosecution and other adverse administrative action up to and including termination.

6. Command and Signal

a. Command. This Order is applicable to all personnel aboard MCAS Cherry Point, Marine Corps Outlying Field Atlantic, Marine Corps Outlying Field Oak Grove, and Marine Corps Auxiliary Landing Field ~~Bouge~~ *Bogue*.

b. Signal. This Order is effective the date signed
