Navy/Marine Corps Relief Society


Collections totaled **\$23,235** in FY14, while over **\$752,713** were distributed to those in need in North Carolina.

Commanding Officer's Message



It is with great pleasure that I present Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Cherry Point's Fiscal Year 2014 (FY14) Economic Impact Statement. This information represents the financial force of Marines, Sailors, and Civilians who live in Eastern North Carolina and are essential to our country's national defense team.

MCAS Cherry Point is a dynamic supporting establishment to the 2d Marine Aircraft Wing and the Fleet Readiness Center East. This partnership plays a vital role in the economic stability of the area and the overall economic health of North Carolina. Strengthening these partnerships and focusing on good stewardship of tax dollars, seeking economies and efficiencies, developing the workforce, and posturing the Air Station, ranges, and outlying fields for the future is key to continued community development and growth.

During FY14, we endured the continuing challenge of "doing more with less" yet the overall economic impact was \$2.048B. The salaries paid to active duty, retired military, current and retired civilians totaled more than \$1.213B. Over \$112M in contracts were awarded, ensuring mission readiness for MCAS Cherry Point and our supported commands while engaging a wide variety of private contractors and service professionals.
