Staff Sgt. Eric C. Groenendaal, a flightline staff noncommissioned officer with Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 366, died of unknown causes at his home in New Bern, N.C., Dec. 30. He was 28.

Staff Sgt. Eric C. Groenendaal, a flightline staff noncommissioned officer with Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 366, died of unknown causes at his home in New Bern, N.C., Dec. 30. He was 28.

Groenendaal, a 10-year veteran of the Marine Corps, deployed four times to Iraq and once to the Horn of Africa. Known among his peers as the "Cobra Commander," Groenendaal's untimely death has had a profound impact on those he served with.

"There's not a Marine in this squadron who didn't personally know, respect and admire Staff Sgt. Groenendaal," said Capt. Derrick F. Breville, assistant operations officer for HMH-366. "Few people can have as much positive influence on a command climate as Groenendaal did. He led from the front and created an atmosphere where Marines could grow and excel."

At the squadron, Groenendaal was considered the "go-to" Marine by fellow CH-53E Super Stallion mechanics, pilots and air crew.

"He was what any commanding officer would want in a staff NCO," said Lt. Col. Trey Meadows, commanding officer of HMH-366.

"Not only was he technically proficient, but he also had a remarkable character and a positive attitude, which he brought to work every day," Meadows said.

Groenendaal was valued by superiors and subordinates alike for his willingness to teach and mentor others.

Students travel cross country to use station simulators

Cherry Point's Marine Aviation Training System Site, or MATSS, hosted 38 Marine and Naval aviation students Dec. 1-11.

The students of Electronic Attack Squadron 129, a training squadron at Naval Air Station Whidbey Island, Wash., came to Cherry Point to conduct training with an EA-6B Prowler simulator at MATSS.

The students usually train with a simulator at NAS Whidbey Island, but it is currently under renovation so the students came to Cherry Point, which possesses the only other Prowler simulator.

"If the students wouldn't have come here, they would have been behind the learning curve in becoming a Prowler pilot," explained Wallace Simmons, the operations coordinator at Cherry Point MATSS.

Jeffrey C. Weber, a site manager at Cherry Point MATSS, said it would have taken the students a lot of time to make up missed time in the simulators.

"But by getting on a plane and flying out here, they didn't miss a beat," Weber added.

Capt. Michael Kempf, the officer in charge for VAQ-129, considered the trip a huge success.

"This trip gave us an opportunity to come to Cherry Point and get ahead," said Kempf. "The personnel at Cherry Point took great care of us and facilitated a great experience."

The MATSS employees regularly work with personnel from aboard the air station, but they were up for the challenge of something different.

"We tried to provide a comfortable training environment for the students," said Weber. "They had full access to our learning center, and we felt we went above and beyond for them."

The station's Marine tactical electronic warfare squadrons also helped by fluctuating their schedules

Opinion: History demonstrates need for EFV

There is no guarantee we will learn from the bloody combat lessons of the last century. The current penchant by some for questioning the Marine Corps' need for an amphibious tracked vehicle suggests an ignorance of history and a lack of understanding of the future; it is unsupported by hard lessons learned, world trends and a security environment characterized by a high degree of uncertainty.

Our nation will most certainly require continued global access from the sea, and just as certainly there are forces at work that are actively and aggressively attempting to deny us that much needed access.

The Secretary of Defense clearly stated that his decision to cut the Expeditionary Fighting Vehicle program does

not call into question the amphibious assault mission of the Marine Corps. Moreover, he stated the requirement of developing a more affordable and sustainable amphibious tractor to provide the Marines a ship-to-shore capability into the future.

As America's expeditionary force in readiness, the Marine Corps specializes in rapidly deploying anywhere in the world to develop access through partnership building activities, to create access in response to crises, and to provide the ability to force access to deter and/or defeat threats. The Corps will never be defined by a program, but rather by the capabilities we bring to the fight.

As a maritime Nation the tyranny of distance, geography, and topography remain constant challenges to

East, West Coast squadrons team up for Enhanced Mojave Viper

Elements of Marine Heavy Lift Helicopter Squadrons 465 and 461 teamed up to prepare for their upcoming deployments to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom during Enhanced Mojave Viper, a predeployment training exercise aboard Marine Corps Air-Ground Combat Center, 29 Palms, Calif., Dec. 9.

The two heavy lift squadrons from Marine Corps Air Station New River, N.C., and MCAS Miramar, Calif., respectively, combined to support ground missions and carried out extensive maintenance to keep their CH-53E Super Stallions in the air the entire time, said Maj. Jade Campbell, a CH-53E pilot with HMH-461.

"We've been executing missions every day," Campbell said. "Both squadrons have been supporting logistics elements with resupply and heavy lifting, and we've been carrying out both day and night raids and (casualty evacuation training) with the grunts, too."

Campbell added the training undertaken during EMV was outstanding and helped the two units to grow together and become more proficient.

"There's ten helicopters split up between us and the other squadron," Campbell said. "We've all been getting along as one big happy family."

Working together was a great test of their skills, said Campbell. "Especially the maintenance guys coming through fixing everything. They've been doing maintenance 24 hours a day, and we've made every mission throughout Mojave Viper."

Pfc. Michael Pettay, an air crewman serving with Campbell, said it was a tough but very fruitful learning experience.

"It's been awesome, we've learned a lot as a crew and as a squadron," the Tullahoma, Tenn., native said. "I can say this much, it's been a pain, but I know I'm not the only one who's feeling more comfortable and confident now than when we first got here."

Lance Cpl. Jonathan Slyman, a CH-53E mechanic with HMH-465, said he's seen everybody gain from the experience, but he's glad to be done with this phase.

"I have a lot more confidence in our new guys than I did when we first got

From the *Chaplain:* The prisons we place ourselves in

A couple of months ago I read a book by Steve Brown called Born Free. The basic premise of the book is that even though freedom exists in God, many people who are followers of God oftentimes don't experience the fullness of that freedom because of self-imposed prisons they allow themselves to live in. Specifically, according to Brown, there are four main categories of prisons that we may find ourselves in.

The first is the prison of what we do. In this prison we beat ourselves up for the wrong we may have done in the past, we feel guilty even though our wrongdoing has been forgiven, or we believe that we are failures or deserve failure because of what we have done. The second set of prisons is in regard to what we think. It is in this prison that we feel trapped by our past, we put ourselves down unnecessarily, or we find ourselves on the endless pursuit of perfectionism. The third category includes those prisons that are associated with how we relate to other people. It is in this

category that we become enslaved to fear, feel responsible for other people, and find our worth based on the approval of other people. (To be open with you, this is the prison that has really had a firm hold on me for a while.) The final set of prisons are those regarding how others try to attempt to control us by means of rules, ritual and puffed-up knowledge.

I wish I had the time and space to describe each prison, however I am sure based on the titles, that some of you reading this article may associate yourself with a number of these prisons (I know I do!). The question I have is how do we weaken the grip that these areas have on our lives and begin to live the life of freedom we were intended to live in the first place. Well here is a plan of action from Dr. Brown passed on using an acronym that may have some help to some of you. The acronym is REFLECT. The R stands for recognize. We need to first come out of denial and recognize the prison that has had such a tight hold on us. The E stands

Paws for a Cause supports military families' pets

The Paws for a Cause Semper Fido initiative is a nonprofit organization out of New Bern that promotes awareness of animals' well-being in eastern North Carolina. Primarily, the organization educates military service members about caring for pets in a military lifestyle and aims to provide fostering solutions during deployments and moves across the country.

Paws for a Cause was chosen to be a part of January's Pepsi Refresh Project in which Pepsi is giving away \$1.3 million each month to fund ideas that benefits a cause.

PFAC is competing against more than 1150 causes that are all in the running for a \$50,000 grant. The top ten vote-getters will receive the grant. Currently, PFAC is ranked 123rd and encourages Marines and their families to vote before January 31st to support their local organization.

Since last year, the Pepsi Refresh Project has accepted proposals from individuals and non-profit organizations who want to make a positive difference in their community. The application and submission process is fairly competitive, according to Kerry McKeel, the co-founder of PFAC. Last fall, PFAC completed the Pepsi Refresh application and submitted the idea to secure funding to build a pet boarding facility for deployed service members.

"Our application was selected based on the merits of our idea as well as our intention to make a positive contribution to the local community," McKeel stated.

If PFAC indeed finishes among the top ten, the \$50,000 grant will be spent as follows: \$46,500 toward building kennels, \$2,500 toward enrichment items such as blankets and toys, and \$1,000 toward promotional activities.

According to McKeel, PFAC's goal is to alleviate the separation and hardship military families endure upon deployment and unit movements by creating a boarding facility specifically geared to provide a temporary fostering solution for their pets.

"In our local community, our county shelters estimate over 50 percent of unwanted pets are brought to their facilities from Marine Corps families unable or unwilling to keep their pets for various reason, including: They did not consider choosing the proper animal for their lifestyle which leads to disenchantment with their pet, the expenses associated with owning a pet, families were unaware of the requirements for registering a pet in military housing, the inability to care for a pet while on deployment, and lack of a plan to properly take their pet on a PCS move," McKeel added.

Cherry Point commissary hosts Special Olympians at annual event

The 43-year-old tradition of the Special Olympics continued at Cherry Point when the commissary hosted a Special Olympians event, Jan. 5.

Three of the competitors in attendance have been chosen to join Team USA to compete in the summer games in Athens, Greece.

Andy Delafield, Amanda Bass and Monica Hernandez are three of the Special Olympians who will help team USA take gold in their respective events and the three were present at the Commissary Special Olympics event.

The Olympics as a whole started in Athens more than 140 years ago, and the athletes that compete still astonish the world with their feats today. In 1968, a new form of the Olympics took place at Soldier Field, Ill., and the event was called the First International Special Olympic Games.

"Some people have no idea what these events are all about," said Phyllis Black, the Commissary director for Cherry Point, who has organized Special Olympic events at the Cherry Point Commissary for the last three years. "These competitors work hard to compete and they train just like normal Olympic athletes."

Delafield has been competing in the Special Olympics for 25 years and at the current age of 31 he is headed to Athens to compete in the 3K, 5K and the 4x400 meter relay.

"Andy loves to compete and is constantly trying to better himself as an athlete

and as a person," said his mother, Marilyn Delafield.

"He doesn't know how to quit and that is what has gotten him where he is today."

Delafield's determination and competitive nature can be taken back to the start of his career with the Special Olympics, but his story took a turn when he was diagnosed with testicular cancer.

"Andy did not let cancer defeat him," said Fredrik Delafield, Delafield's father. "Andy defeated his cancer and not even a month later ran his first 5K and finished. He's ran in multiple 5Ks, 10Ks, and has even competed in a few half marathons."

Delafield's love for the service members of this country is linked with his love for a good run.

Fredrik Delafield remembered one moment when Delafield competed in the Marine Corps Marathon – once he crossed the finish line he dropped and did 20 push-ups.

"The Marines at the Marine Corps Marathon gathered around him and did push-ups alongside him," said Fredrik Delafield.

"Since then every time he finishes a run he drops and does 20 push-ups."

Black explained when Delafield heard about the competition here he personally requested the chance to run with a group of Marines after the competition.

"When I received the e-mail about Andy's request to run with a group of Marines I thought it was great and was happy to make sure he got his wish," said Sgt. Maj. Jerry L. Bailey, the sergeant major of MCAS Cherry Point. "I was a little worried that my Marines wouldn't be

able to keep up with this stud of a runner, but the Marines were ready and willing to do their part to help this Olympian train." Delafield and more than 20 Marines formed up after the competition for the run and called cadences for the whole two and a half miles.

Once the small group returned from their run, the Marines formed up one more time to give their encouragement to Delafield in their own way, chanting, "Andy's gonna win! Andy's gonna win! Andy's gonna win! Andy's gonna win!"



Cherry Point community members share perils of speeding

When Marines get behind the wheel of a vehicle, they're putting themselves at the mercy of potential roadway hazards, other drivers or unforeseen weather conditions – all of which they have no control over.

Something drivers can always control is the speed of their vehicle, yet speeding is one of the leading causes of auto accidents and is the most common traffic infraction aboard the air station, explained Cpl. Wesley R. Vawter, an accident investigator with the Cherry Point Provost Marshal's Office.

"In most instances, the driver isn't paying attention," Vawter said. "Most of the time, the severity of the speeding is around 10 mph over the speed limit."

Going 15 mph over is an automatic suspension of driving privileges on the air station, added Vawter, and could result in a suspended license off base.

Most people would admit they're not angels when it comes to the occasional speeding. Whether they're late

for work, trying to make it to a movie or just not paying attention, they push harder than they should on the gas pedal. But the consequences of speeding can be much more severe than walking into a movie late.

About four years ago, on a weekday morning in West Palm Beach, Fla., Trish A. Grigg was seated in her vehicle at a red light, listening to the radio. It was about eight o'clock and she had just dropped her kids off at school, like she did every day.

Trish and her husband, Staff Sgt. Ricky N. Grigg, a telephone and computer maintenance shop chief at Marine Wing Communications Squadron 28, were living in West Palm Beach while Ricky was assigned to 4th Air Naval Gunfire Liaison Company.

"I drove that route every morning," Trish explained. Then, while Trish's car was still stuck at the red light, a large vehicle that Trish estimated to be a seven-ton truck, sped out of control and smashed into the back of her 1998 Toyota Rav4, totaling the small SUV.

"I didn't even realize what hit me," said Trish. "It changed my whole life."

Trish's neck was fractured in several places and radically changed her once active and outgoing lifestyle to one where she wasn't able to walk for more than a year and a half.

"I'm still recovering," Trish said.

Police reports directly attributed the morning collision to speeding, said Trish.


"Speeding happens most during the morning traffic rush to work," said Vawter, "But it's funny because when we catch speeders, they end up being late for work anyway."

Vawter added that people should give themselves a little extra time, especially during the winter months.

The speed limit aboard the air station is 25 mph, unless otherwise posted, but it never exceeds 45 mph.

"Cruise control is always a good idea," Trish added, "because nobody is perfect."

Perfect or not, everybody can control the speed of their vehicle.

our global influence. As demonstrated countless times, our ability to come from the sea and overcome the challenges of natural and manmade barriers allows us to protect and defend U.S. interests. Our continued ability to respond is dependent on our ability to operate in uncertain environments, create opportunities, and ensure freedom of action regardless of access challenges.

The Marine Corps has learned that amphibious operations should avoid fixed defenses whenever possible. This option is not always available, however. In such cases the amphibious tracked vehicle is essential to success. The tracked amphibious vehicle provides the ability to perform three critical tasks: ship-to-shore movement, breakout from the beach and protected land mobility and firepower. As a result, the amphibious tracked vehicle has been a mainstay of amphibious capability. It has often proven the indispensable, enabling capability that Marines employ to both solve the sea/land mobility challenge and to gain advantage over our enemies.

Recent operational experience and history attest to the effectiveness of amphibious tracked vehicles in providing the capability and capacity demanded by numerous operating environments – permissive, uncertain or hostile. Most recently, amphibious tracked vehicles assisted in overcoming the devastated infrastructure in Haiti. These same vehicles were used to rescue stranded citizens and deliver relief supplies following Katrina's devastation of the U.S. Gulf Coast in 2005. In the 1990s these vehicles enabled relief efforts in Somalia during Operation Restore Hope and subsequently provided the key capability necessary to safely withdraw U.N. forces in United Shield. During the Korean War they allowed us to project power from the sea at Inchon to reverse the looming defeat of U.S. forces trapped at Pusan. Given the proliferation of area denial weapons among both state and non-state actors, we believe that future operations – even those conducted for benign reasons – will be conducted under uncertain and highly dangerous conditions.

Amphibious tracked vehicles employed from ships at sea provide the means to assure littoral access that no other capability can provide. They are the only combat vehicles built to operate effectively in the littorals: a complex environment of salt and fresh water, muddy marshes and estuaries, and dry land; rural, suburban and urban landscapes; wildly varying terrain; high to low population densities; and temperature extremes. They can quickly and seamlessly transit from ship-to-shore as well as swim rivers and negotiate inland water obstacles, providing the ability to achieve tactical and operational surprise. They protect their occupants as they maneuver on sea and land to a position of advantage and can close with an enemy or rescue our friends. Their known presence off shore historically has been a powerful deterrent and effective capability across the range of military operations.

A modern amphibious tracked vehicle uses the sea as maneuver space, creates opportunities in the littorals, optimizes employment of amphibious forces, and enhances survivability in the face of area denial threats. An amphibious tracked vehicle is the proven means to overcome access challenges, natural or manmade, ranging from tsunami-ravaged infrastructure to an armed aggressor seeking to oppose our maneuver. Amphibious tracked vehicles empower a flexible, ship-borne force to wait off shore for the opportunity to shape the security environment or alter an outcome. This unique capability provides our nation with a critical power projection asset.

There is no doubt that the sustainment and further development of our nation's amphibious capability is important for continued access to strategically vital regions of the world. We see a clear mandate to be ready to shape, influence, deter, and if necessary, defeat would be forces that seek to deny us access. Meeting this mandate will allow us to profit "by dear bought experience" rather than repeat the errors of the past.

"I could go to Staff Sgt. Groenendaal with any question I had – no matter how meaningless or complicated," said Cpl. Tyzell L. Williams, a CH-53E mechanic with HMH-366. "He never gave a belittling response, and he always believed in a Marine's ability to learn. He was never the type to micromanage you – he'd always be out in the hangar with you, teaching you everything he could about the aircraft."

Groenendaal was cited with frequently telling his Marines: "The second you think you know everything, is the second you're useless to the squadron."

"He was a great leader, and he was humble about it too," said Cpl. Cutler W. Bakke, a CH-53E mechanic with HMH-366. "It's going to be hard not having him around, and he'll be sorely missed by everyone."

A memorial service was held at the air station chapel Friday in honor of Groenendaal.

He is survived by his wife, Cindy; parents, David and Christy; brothers, Matthew and Herbert; maternal grandfather, Dillen; and paternal grandparents, David and Lorraine.

Groenendaal will be laid to rest today in his hometown of Erie, Pa.

in the flight simulators to accommodate the student pilots, who accumulated more than 120 flight hours while at the air station.

"We really pulled together and showed what the Navy-Marine Corps team is all about," said Simmons. "We were prepared to support those guys as long as they needed us."

MATSS Cherry Point is operated by three civilian contractor companies, and they felt it took a team effort to assist the students.

"It showed a lot about us," said Robert Q. Rainwater, a site manager at MATSS Cherry Point. "Everyone set their problems aside and accomplished the mission at hand."

"The tempo we've worked at here definitely helped us out in the long run in terms of experience," said Slyman. "To win a war you have to be willing to put in the time, effort and have the know-how to make it count, which these two squadrons do."

Campbell said the next time they'll see HM-465 will be in Afghanistan. The squadrons will deploy simultaneously later this winter, along with the infantry and logistics battalions they helped to support during EMV.

for elucidate, prompting us to meditate on our past so that we come to an understanding of the facts that need to be turned over to God. F is for forgive; a forgiveness that we might have to extend to others depending on the circumstances, but definitely a forgiveness that we must embrace for ourselves. L is for liberate, encouraging us to embrace the freedom that we have in Christ. E is for eulogize. When we turn something over to God or turn away from something, our person has to go through a grieving process to fully get over that thing. C stands for cage or take captive. This is taking control of negative self talk or thoughts that might encourage us to relapse in our former way of acting. Finally, T stands for Thanksgiving. This is giving thanks to God for dealing with this issue so that we can experience more of the freedom offered to us through Him.

I encourage you to practice REFLECT as much as you can. There may be some people reading this that might need a little more support depending on the hurts, habits and hang-ups that exist in their lives at this moment. If you do need some extra support, I encourage you to seek out 12-step recovery groups that are designed to help people break free from these prisons and experience the freedom that we all were meant to experience. We don't have to be in the prisons we may find ourselves in. As Follower of Jesus, we are free; so if we are enslaved by any one of these prisons, it's about time that we seek God and break free!







Monday marks the nationally observed birthday of Martin Luther King Jr. It's a day when people across the U.S. will remember the famous minister from Georgia who didn't just want to achieve equal rights for blacks, but strove for equality between every man, woman and child in America.

Martin Luther King Jr.'s fight for equality

Monday marks the nationally observed birthday of Martin Luther King Jr. It's a day when people across the U.S. remember the famous minister from Georgia who didn't just want to achieve equal rights for blacks, but strove for equality between every man, woman and child in America. King saw the inevitable good in everyone and sought to bring that benevolence out of all people.

"It's a day of reflection, when we as a nation look at the contributions that have made this nation great," said Gunnery Sgt. Harsheen T. Eady, the equal opportunity advisor for Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point. "Monday is a day we are reminded that everybody has value."

In King's famous speech, "I Have a Dream," he spoke to all Americans, from all backgrounds, about standing up for equality in a nonviolent revolution. King's words captivated more than 200,000 people who gathered at the Lincoln Memorial on that warm August day in 1963. Thousands more watched the speech on television from their living rooms.

King's many speeches and nonviolent actions were instrumental in shaping the nation's outlook on equality. He helped bring about a way to fight for freedom with righteousness, a way to turn ignorant oppressors into understanding companions, and a way to transform a nation of many colors into a more compassionate society, with the key being nonviolence.

The "I Have a Dream" speech did not just motivate a people, but it was a sermon to evoke a major transformation in the nation's society.

Rena Shedrick-Marshall was born and raised in Washington, D.C., during those tumultuous times. She was 12 years old when King gave his famous speech and remembers his message well.

"He was saying that this is no time to engage in the luxury of cooling off," said Shedrick-Marshall.

King lifted peoples' spirits and urged them to continue their commitment to equality. "We are not advocating violence," King said after his house was bombed Jan. 30, 1956, during the Montgomery bus boycott. "We want to love our enemies."

Those who made the pledge to follow King were challenged to do so in a nonviolent fight for true freedom. King's philosophy was to passively battle an ignorant society, and he asked all participants to live by his beliefs.

"Let us not satisfy our thirst for freedom by drinking from the cup of bitterness and hatred," said King.

With these words and through his own actions, King urged people to be strong and wrestle their own temptations to viciously fight their "enemy." King stressed that staying peaceful in protest is a way to do the opposite of what people expect and brings the fight to a higher plane of dignity.

King also found guidance and motivation from other earthly leaders, such as Mahatma Gandhi.

Gandhi was one of the most respected political and spiritual leaders in India during the Indian Nationalist Movement for India's independence. He would fast and not eat for weeks to encourage his people to follow him and stay nonviolent in their fight.

Gandhi was arrested multiple times for going against the laws of the British, yet he stayed strong and even found honor in serving time in jail for doing what was right. King had many of the same struggles as Gandhi, for he spent many nights in a cold jail cell himself for breaking laws, such as conducting a nonviolent march without a parade license.

King actually wrote a famous letter from a jail in Birmingham, Ala. In his long letter, he quoted the Bible, "Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you and persecute you."

During that time in history, King had an enormous battle to fight against a surge of violence.

"I was terrified during that time," said Shedrick-Marshall. "People thought back then that the only way to control a person was through violence. If we had more control of ourselves we wouldn't have had as much violence."

The nation hasn't fully fulfilled King's dreams. There isn't segregation made by law, but self-segregation in churches, business offices and in schools. Violence is still found among all races, often a result of frustration born from ignorance. Right now, thousands of American men and women are fighting for peace in foreign lands.

"Look where we are now, we're fighting side-by-side every day. But, even today, we have a long road to travel," said Shedrick-Marshall.

King's "I Have a Dream" speech was a pivotal point in the climb to equality. He inspired a whole nation to stand as one in justice and hope for all people.

"When he was making the speech, it not only affected the Negro, it affected the entire nation ... like he said, 'We will all be able to join hands and be one people and one country,'" said Shedrick-Marshall.

Eady added that Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday is not just a day to take off work, but a day of service, when people can take the opportunity to give back to their community.

"That is what makes this country great," said Eady.

King's peaceful revolution in the 1960s conveyed that the best way to defeat oppression is to passively resist the racist institutions.

King said, "With this faith we will be able to transform the jangling discords of our nation into a beautiful symphony of brotherhood."

Naval Health Clinic promotes cervical cancer awareness

The United States Congress designated January as Cervical Health Awareness Month. The staff at Naval Health Clinic Cherry Point would like to take this opportunity to highlight facts related to cervical cancer, human papillomavirus and the importance of early detection.

According to the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention, cervical cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths among women around the world. In the United States, about 12,000 women are diagnosed with cervical cancer each year and approximately 4,000 are expected to die from it. However, the incidence of cervical cancer and the number of related deaths are significantly decreasing as a result of women taking early detection precautions such as regular Pap tests.

Genital HPV, is the main cause of cervical cancer. HPV is also the most common sexually transmitted virus in the United States. More than half of sexually active men and women are infected with HPV at some time in their lives. Furthermore, about 20 million Americans are currently infected, and about six million more will be infected each year.

Essentially all cervical cancers are directly linked to HPV. According to the CDC, "You are more likely to get HPV if you started having sex at an early age, or if you

or your partner has had sex with several others." On the other hand, any man or woman who is sexually active is potentially at risk for HPV. The good news for most individuals is that HPV may perhaps go away on its own, but if it does not, it may cause cervical cancer over time.

Helpful precautionary actions to prevent cervical cancer:

1. See your doctor regularly for a Pap test that can find cervical pre-cancers.
2. Follow up with your doctor if your Pap test results are not normal.
3. Don't smoke.
4. Use condoms during sex.
5. Limit your number of sexual partners.
6. Get the HPV vaccine, Gardasil. Gardasil protects against the two types of HPV that cause up to 90 percent of genital warts and the two types of HPV that cause up to 70 percent of cervical cancer. In addition to preventing cervical cancer, it can also prevent vaginal and vulvar cancer in females, and genital warts and warts in the throat in both males and females. HPV vaccine is offered to men and women ages 9 through 26.

For maximal effectiveness, the HPV vaccine should be given prior to first sexual activity and any possible exposure to HPV. The HPV vaccine is administered as three

separate injections.

Gardasil may not fully protect everyone and it will not prevent all types of cervical diseases. Existing cervical cancer and genital warts cannot be treated with Gardasil, nor will it protect against diseases caused by other HPV types or other types of sexually transmitted infections. Since the vaccine does not protect against all strains of HPV, all women should still have regularly scheduled Pap smears to screen for cervical cancer.

The vaccine is available at the NHCCP immunization and military medicine clinics. This vaccine will be available to all eligible females and males between the ages of 9 to 26 years old. A referral is not needed and vaccination is offered on a walk-in basis Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Only a doctor or healthcare professional can help you decide if HPV vaccination is right for you or your child. For more information or to schedule an appointment, call NHCCP's appointment line at 466-0921.

“THE TOURIST” (PG-13)

“The Tourist” is an intriguing thriller about an innocent pair of strangers in trouble in Europe.

Johnny Depp (“Public Enemies,” “Pirates of the Caribbean”) stars as Frank Tulpelo, an ordinary, everyday frumpy looking teacher from Wisconsin, who is on an impromptu trip to Europe to mend a broken heart where he soon finds himself in a flirtatious encounter with a beautiful woman.

Angelina Jolie (“Salt,” “Wanted,” “Changeling”) stars as Elise Clifton-Ward, an extraordinary and mysterious woman who deliberately crosses Frank’s path.

Elise is apparently the object of police surveillance and drags Frank into a web of mistaken identity intrigue.

Frank is a similar looking man as Elise’s former lover, a criminal named Alexander Pearce, who is wanted in 14 countries, and who stole a huge amount of money from a Russian mobster, Ivan Demidov, played by Steven Berkoff (“Steal”).

Alexander is also being pursued by the Scotland Yard Inspector Acheson, played by Paul Bettany (“Legion,” “A Beautiful Mind”), for money laundering.

Against the breathtaking backdrop of Venice, Frank and Elise whirlwind acquaintance quickly evolves into apparent romantic encounters, and soon they find themselves unwittingly thrust into a deadly game of cat and mouse.

Also appearing are Rufus Sewell (“The Holiday”) as The Englishman, who is also chasing the mysterious Pearce; and Timothy Dalton (“Hot Fuzz”) as Jones, the cranky boss of the Scotland Yard agents.

German director Florian Henckel von Donnersmarck (“The Lives of Others”), who also collaborated on the screenplay, attempts this remake of the 2005 French film “Anthony Zimmer,” that follows a series of manipulations of characters before they realize that they are merely pieces being played by a mastermind of the game.

“The Tourist” is a stylish and laidback caper, laced at times with a little humor. The storyline has lots of twists and turns; however the lame script leaves the two hot stars little to work with and therefore they never quite click together.

“THE FIGHTER” (R)

“The Fighter” is the life story about the early years of boxer “Irish” Micky Ward and his brother Dicky Eklund.

It is the true story of two brothers who, against all odds, come together to train for a historic title bout that will unite their fractured family, redeem their pasts, and give their hard-luck town what it has been waiting for – a sense of pride.

The biopic film tells the story of the fighter’s unlikely road from nothing to the world light welterweight title.

It chronicles the brother’s early days in the 1980 on the rough streets of Lowell, Mass., through one brother’s battle with drugs and the other’s eventual world championship in London.

Mark Wahlberg (“The Departed,” “Max Payne,” “Shooter”) stars as “Irish” Micky Ward, a welterweight from Massachusetts, who rose from professional punching bag to champion with the help of his brother Dicky.

Christian Bale (“The Dark Knight,” “Batman Begins”) co-stars as Dicky Eklund, Ward’s crack-addict half brother, a boxer turned trainer who shepherded him to his Rocky-like success.

Amy Adams (“Leap Year,” “Julie & Julia,” “Doubt”) co-stars as Micky’s girlfriend, the feisty Charlene Fleming, who encouraged him along the way.

Also appearing is Melissa Leo (“Righteous Kill”) as Alice Ward and Jack McGee (“The International”) as George Ward, the parents of Micky and Dicky, who also raised several sisters.

David Russell (“Three Kings,” “Flirting with Disaster,” “I Heart Huckabees”) directed this story about an ordinary man who beat the odds, who was a talented fighter with a shaky start and who became America’s working class hero.

“The Fighter” is a gutsy portrayal of a dysfunctional family and an uplifting and inspirational docudrama of the remarkable rise of a determined man who fights on his own terms.

This film is one of the year’s best with outstanding performances throughout.

“TRUE GRIT” (PG-13)

“True Grit” is a slightly different remake of a classic Western film about the tale of a tough U.S. Marshal who helps a stubborn young girl track down her father’s murderer.

Hailee Steinfeld, whose character also serves as the narrator, makes her film debut as Mattie Ross, the spunky 14-year-old farm girl who is living in the 19th century frontier land, and who after the murder of her father by a hired hand, sets out to capture the killer.

Jeff Bridges (“Crazy Heart,” “Iron Man”) takes on the role of U.S. Marshal Reuben J. “Rooster” Cogburn, the aging, drunken, one-eyed lawman, a man with true grit.

Mattie hires the tough U.S. Marshal, and insists on coming with him, despite his objections, to seek vengeance and bringing her father’s killer to justice.

However, his drinking and generally abusive character does not sit well with her. They make the trek into the Indian Nations in search of the ruthless killer, Tom Chaney, played by Josh Brolin (“W,” “Milk,” “Jonah Hex”).

Matt Damon (“Hereafter,” “Invictus,” “Green Zone”) co-stars as La Boeuf, a dim-witted Texas Ranger, who joins the pair in their hunt and who wants Chaney for his own purpose.

The unlikely trio experience lots of danger and surprises on their long journey.


Also appearing are Barry Pepper (“Seven Pounds”) as “Lucky” Ned Pepper, an outlaw; and Nicholas Sadler (“Fair Game”) as Sullivan.

The talented directors and writers Ethan and Joel Coen (“A Serious Man,” “Burn After Reading,” “No Country for Old Men”) retell the old classic with true authenticity and adapted the story from the 1968 novel by Charles Portis rather than the 1969 Western made famous by John Wayne, as the hard-drinking hired gun.

“True Grit” is a great example of taking an old tale and classic movie and bringing a whole new approach to the story.

This is a kind of screwball Western that is very entertaining, has marvelous performances by Bridges and Damon, however with Steinfeld as the dominant outstanding one, good old-fashioned humor and beautiful filmed landscapes.

This version takes a wiser and more faithful approach to the tale and is a wonderful family treat for young and old.


