Hammerhead detachment returns from Afghanistan

Marines, friends and families waited for more than a hundred Marines with Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 366 to return from a seven-month deployment from Camp Leatherneck, Afghanistan, Feb. 9.

The anticipation grew as a USO trailer with two televisions showed a video feed of the homecoming Marines departing the plane at Cherry Point, allowing the families to see their loved ones earlier than expected.

The Hammerhead detachment left in July 2010 to join HMH-361 at Camp Leatherneck

in support of I Marine Expeditionary Force (Forward).

For many of the young Marines, it was a firsthand look at what it's like being in a combat zone during a deployment.

"It was a really good experience to actually do what we train for," said Cpl. Shaun D. Berhow, a CH-53E Super Stallion helicopter crew chief with HMH-366. "To move around troops and supplies and provide support from the sky felt great."

The detachment consisted of 134 Marines

MRX fine-tunes air combat integration

Elements of 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing (Forward) at Cherry Point participated in the II Marine Expeditionary Force's mission rehearsal exercise Jan. 24 through Feb. 4. 2nd MAW (Fwd.) will serve as the aviation combat element for II MEF operations in Afghanistan.

"The MRX is used to provide II MEF (Fwd.) a realistic training venue to prepare for the upcoming deployment," said Maj. Brad Magrath a Marine Air-Ground Task Force staff training program observer and trainer.

Lt. Col. Dirk Cooper, a senior watch officer for 2nd MAW (Fwd.)'s tactical air command center, explained that the MRX is all about refining skills and developing relationships with other combat elements.

"The purpose of the MRX is to ensure and maximize the effectiveness of Marine air assets by assuring as much tactical efficiency as we can," said Cooper. "So far, the MRX is a huge improvement over previous exercises. We've stepped up the size and players involved in the scenarios, and everyone has a good knowledge of our area of operation. This has been a tremendous workup."

First wave of 2nd MAW (Fwd) Marines head for Afghanistan

The first wave of Marines with 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing (Forward) departed Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point in the early morning Feb. 9.

Over the next month, more than 250 Marines will deploy with 2nd MAW (Fwd.) to relieve 3rd MAW (Fwd.) in support of operations in southern Afghanistan.

The forward element will conduct aviation operations in support of the regional command southwest with a primary mission of commanding and controlling all Marine Corps aviation assets.

"It is 2nd MAW (Fwd.)'s job to provide all aviation support assets," said Col. Russell A. C. Sanborn, assistant wing commander for 2nd MAW (Fwd.) "We are there to literally support that lance corporal on the ground. We will provide anything from air assault, kinetic fires and casualty evacuation to transporting food, supplies and water."

"This is what I joined for," said Lance Cpl. Shiquessa T. Howard, an aviation operations specialist with 2nd MAW (Fwd.). "I'm anx-

ious but I am ready. I've been training for months, and I couldn't be more prepared for this deployment."

The Wing will provide all six functions of Marine Corps aviation, from assault support to aerial reconnaissance during the deployment.

"I feel confident about this deployment," said Staff Sgt. Glenn Williams Jr., an aviation operations specialist with 2nd MAW (Fwd.). "I signed up to do this and I'm ready."

The last time 2nd MAW (Fwd.) activated was for a 2009 deployment to Iraq, but this will be the first time 2nd MAW (Fwd.) headquarters is deploying to Afghanistan.

The Marine Corps mission in the big picture of Afghanistan is to defeat the insurgency in partnership with its allies and a blossoming Afghan government, said Sanborn.

"We are going there to help them," said Col. Ben D. Hancock, the chief of staff for 2nd MAW (Fwd.). "We are also giving the Afghans the tools to help themselves."

Chaplain: Be a disciple

Discipline is a word that gets tossed around a lot in military circles and especially in the Marine Corps. To say a person is disciplined is a compliment. To discipline someone or rather, to have to be disciplined by someone else is seen as a negative personal trait, as it should be. However, what we forget about the whole idea of discipline is that it is related to being a disciple or follower of something greater than ourselves. Generally, it has been used in a religious context to me the follower of some particular faith such as a disciple of Jesus Christ in the Christian Faith.

To be disciplined is to adhere to those values that we have committed ourselves to following. The reason that we admire a disciplined Marine or Sailor is because even in adverse circumstances or personal trails this individual manages to hold fast to the values we all have sworn to uphold such as honor, courage and commitment. It is right and good that we should do so. Lifting up, in a modest way, those around us who meet and ex-

ceed the values and expectations we cherish is not only a constant reminder of what we hope to become, but also a vivid example that indeed it is possible for us to do the same.

The trouble sometimes in a work, family or really any relationship is that we forget that discipline and disciple are linked. Too often we approach discipline as an opportunity to punish someone; to make them think twice about ever crossing the line or missing the mark or not meeting our expectations ever again. So, Marines and Sailors are disciplined by others through obscenity, or humiliation, or disgusting work in order to make them have such a distasteful experience they then will turn from their ways and start meeting standards again. The problem is that most of this is in the form of negative reinforcement which has shown to improve behavior for a time, but in the long haul never works as well as positive influence.

Does this mean folks should never clean a bathroom or we

Legal: Be aware of money scams

These days, there are no shortages of scumbags trying to scam people out of their money. Online shopping has made people more susceptible to falling victim to a variety of these scams. In some cases, the thieves are very clever and appear to be legitimate. Here are a few of the most popular and reoccurring scams that I have seen.

The first and newest one that I have seen is a person calling you pretending to be from your credit card company's fraud department. The caller informs you that there have been unusual purchases made on your account. What makes this a dangerous call is that the person already has your credit card number, the bank that issued the card and in some cases, they even have your address. The thief uses that information to gain your confidence and to add legitimacy to the call.

Usually, the fake agent will ask if you purchased something for around 450-499 dollars. Once you say that you did not purchase the item(s), the person informs you that the financial institution will be crediting you for that amount. Of course, the thief has no intention of ever crediting your account. This ploy is yet another step in reassuring you that this is actually a representative of the financial institution.

The fake agent will then gave you a number to call if you have any questions. This is the same number on the back of the debit card. The thief then gives a six digit reference number with the

instruction to give it to the operator if you call the number on the back of the card. Of course, this number is fake but take into account that the fake agent already has your card number, the bank it was issued from, your address, and your name, so you can see how this all may seem like a legitimate phone call.

The scam happens when the thief asks to verify that you are in possession of the card. The fake agent will ask you to turn the card over and read the last three numbers on the back. This is the security number and the number you probably use when you make internet purchases. Once you tell him the numbers, he will say it is correct and direct you to have a nice day and once again to call the number on the back of the card if you have any questions.

The three digit security code is all he needs to steal money from you or to make charges on your account. The thief already has all the other necessary information to make charges. If you run into this scam, do not give out the security code. Instead, hang up the phone and call your financial institutions fraud department. Remember, your financial institution will never contact you for this information.

Most phones have caller ID. Be sure to provide the caller's phone number to the fraud department and the local police department. The phone number can be used to track down the thief so they can be caught and prosecuted.

The Lifestyle Insights Networking Knowledge and Skills for Kids program taught two classrooms of school children about the unique challenges of being in a military family at Havelock Elementary School Feb. 11.

They also watched the Elite Warrior recruiting video. Capt. David Livingston, a tactical air command center officer for Marine Tactical Air Command Squadron 28, taught this portion of the class and showed the class his noncommissioned officer's sword and officer's sword.

The second section dealt with the emotional aspect of being a child in a military family. The children learned about how to deal with the hassles of moving around the country, such as leaving an old familiar world behind and growing comfortable with their new world. They were taught who to talk with and what to talk about when dealing with the challenging emotions of their parents being away on deployment.

The final lesson focused on how to stay safe while surfing the internet.

To wrap it up, the children learned the first verse of the Marine's Hymn and sang it for their parents who were waiting in the gymnasium to give them cookies, drinks and take them home at the end of the day.

After the event Jessica L. Livingston, a L.I.N.K.S. trainer, considered the program to be a success with the children and the parents.

"I think the program went extraordinarily well," said Jessica, "I was delighted to see the military support from Havelock elementary and all of the military parents that allowed their children to come."

David also believed that the event went well and was of great benefit to both the children and himself.

"I thought it was great," David said. "It gave the kids a chance to show how they feel about their parents being gone and other topics. My degree is in elementary education, and it got me back into the classroom. I love to work with elementary students."

Between learning about what their parents do and singing songs, the children had a fun-filled educational experience.

"I like to learn about what my father does," said Steven, a student at Havelock Elementary School. "It helped me learn a lot of fun things to do and other things I can try. I think the Marine Corps is an awesome thing. That's what I want to be when I grow up, a Marine."





US, Colombian Marines conduct tactical unmanned aerial vehicle exchange

COVENAS, Sucre, Colombia – Marines from a security cooperation task force held a tactical unmanned aerial vehicle subject matter expert exchange with Colombian counter intelligence Marines aboard the Colombian Marine Infantry Training Base Feb. 2.

The SCTF is embarked aboard USS Gunston Hall in support of Amphibious Southern Partnership Station 2011 in the U.S. Southern Command area of responsibility to strengthen ties with regional partner nations.

The A-SPS concept is dedicated to building relationships, interoperability, and improving each participating country's capabilities.

The exchange consisted of an overview of the Raven RQ11 system's capability, basic information about the Raven, and a hands-on flight demonstration.

The Raven is a mobile, lightweight but tough, user-friendly observation information system. It takes approximately 10 minutes to setup, weighs approximately 4.2 lbs, and has a wingspan of 51 inches.

"The Raven is meant for smaller units, and is typically used for reconnaissance missions," said Cpl. Christopher J. Maharg, Raven subject matter expert with Marine Wing Support Squadron 271. "It is a great tool because it shoots 'live-view' video."

The Raven can remain in flight for about 80 minutes, and collects live-feed video data in both color and infrared. It can collect color video looking forward and to the side, while infrared is strictly forward.

"This was a great demonstration," said Navy Capt. Brian C. Nickerson, A-SPS 11 mission commander. "It was impressive watching our young Marines operate this system and speak with confidence and authority on the

Raven's capabilities. It was also interesting to hear our Colombian partner's share their description of a similar battlefield capability."

A-SPS 11 is a United States Southern Command directed operation implemented by Commander, United States Naval Forces Southern Command supported by

United States Marine Corps Forces South; and carried out by Commander, Destroyer Squadron Four Zero; USS Gunston Hall and a Marine Corps Security Cooperation Task Force.

The tactical air command center is the 2nd MAW (Fwd.) commanding general's command and control center. From there, all aviation activity within the area of operation can be monitored including British Royal Air Force activity.

Military officers from the United Kingdom served as observers and advisors during the exercise as well.

During the scenarios TACC personnel monitored and reacted to situations involving the aircraft in their AO. They coordinated medical evacuations, responded to troops in contact, and solved problems concerning reduction in fuel incidents.

Cooper said prior training allowed personnel to fine-tune the relationship between the MEF and the MAW.

"We helped the MEF mature in their integration of aviation," Cooper said. "The fact that we had already trained together allowed us to focus on integration vice internal learning. The relationship developed between us and the MEF was the biggest benefit of this exercise."

"There's always room for improvement," said Magrath. "We try to make it as realistic as possible given exercise limitations and what the units will actually encounter while in country."

Cooper praised the execution of the exercise's scenarios as well.

"I don't think I've personally participated in a more realistic exercise," said Cooper. "Ten years at war have helped us train how we will fight. MSTP's abilities have really come a long way."

result to "time out" for bad behavior instead? No, and in fact physical labor and reviewing the fundamentals are good ways to help reboot someone who has gone off track. But in teaching someone a lesson we need to remember that discipline should be just that. When we discipline it should always be with the intent to remind a Marine of the high ideals to which they aspired when they first set foot on the "yellow footprints". It should be to bring them back to who they said they desired to become when they were first sworn into service. Discipline should be less about punishment and more about lessons learned. It should be about helping fellow Marines to sharpen their skills more than just a shape up or ship out mentality. It should teach them something more than just to resent those they work with day to day or demoralizing them into believing the opportunity to be a "good" Marine no longer exists.

Certainly it is a two-way street and the Marine who is being disciplined needs to remember that it's an opportunity to improve, to reboot, to get a new start. It is unfair for Marines who fail to want to act like Marines to detract from the mission by requiring so much time at personal instruction, and there may even be Marines who serve for a time but need not serve for a career. But, as a decorated sergeant major told me recently, stern motivation and simply screaming at a recruit is necessary for boot camp where the negative parts of a recruit's former lifestyle need to be stripped away and he or she can be rebuilt, once they hit the fleet it is another story. For now those men and women have earned their EGA, and it is time to help them develop in a professional way. Can discipline be tough or even just seem tough at the time? Sure. Read Hebrews 12:11. The difference between discipline and a punishment power trip can seem slight at the time, but in the long run they produce results that are worlds apart.

So, how do we know the difference? It's in the way it is done, but also in the motivation. Is the discipline we are imposing tearing a Marine down or building him up? That is the question we should continually ask when we are in charge and the answer is critical to the readiness and success of the Marine Corps. So, when you get a turn being in charge, don't just get compliance, make a disciple instead.

and Sailors, which included an advanced party of Marines that arrived last month.

The other scam involves a thief who has access to your credit report. The scam works when they call informing you that they are a collection agency collecting a debt. Since they have access to your credit report, they know what accounts you may have opened years ago that you have not closed. If there has been no activity in a long time, the thief makes it seem like you forgot to pay a charge or debt that is long overdue. The thief will offer to settle right now over the phone or they will take you to court.

If you run into this situation, do not settle over the phone. Instead, go to www.annualcreditreport.com and print out a copy of your credit report. Look it over to see if you have any accounts in collection or in default. Once you determine the call was not legitimate and that you do not owe any money, call the Federal Trade Commission or visit <http://www.ftc.gov> and alert them of the situation. You should also contact your local police department.

For those who know of any other scams or have been to a victim of one, please notify the legal Assistance Attorneys at the Joint Law Center. Even if the issue has been resolved, let us know so we can get the word out to the rest of our Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point community. FRC East expects CV-22 in May

Fleet Readiness Center East is once again answering the call to support the warfighter – this time for the United States Air Force. In the spring of 2010, Headquarters Air Force Special Operations Command based at Hurlburt Field, Fort Walton Beach, Fla., contacted FRC East seeking its support of the Air Force CV-22 Osprey fleet. In its request, AFSOC detailed specific work requirements to be executed by a FRC East depot field team, supplemented by AFSOC's On-Site Quick Response Team, staffed by civilian contractors. Because of the relatively small CV-22 fleet size, AFSOC issued a challenging turnaround time objective to minimize down time and maximize mission readiness. In response, FRC East met the challenge by developing a plan to perform a planned maintenance interval along with a concurrent D-Phase Inspection on each CV-22 in just 30 calendar days. The plan uses a two-shift depot field team requiring approximately 25

FRC East workers. In the past several months, meetings organized by PMA-275 have been held in Havelock and Fort Walton Beach. During these meetings, PMA, AFSOC, and FRC East personnel drafted a Depot Maintenance Interservice Support Agreement, including a Statement of Work documenting the roles and responsibilities of all participants. Signature is expected on the final DMISA by February 2011. In November, a site survey of the designated work areas within hangar 91266 at Hurlburt Field was conducted by FRC East personnel. The FRC East CV-22 team, under the guidance of David Williams, V-22/H-53 Branch head, is continuing its efforts to address all the logistical requirements in advance of the first CV-22 induction, planned for May 2011. Induction of a second FY 2011 aircraft is scheduled for July. Workload is projected to grow to four aircraft a year in FY 2012 and FY 2013, with the possibility of that workload doubling by FY 2014.

"THE GREEN HORNET" (PG-13)

"The Green Hornet" an action-comedy adventure film based on the American pulp hero and masked vigilante who appeared in numerous comic book series. The Green Hornet, a super hero, is the alter ego of Britt Reid, a daring young news paper publisher by day and who goes out at night to fight crime with his faithful valet Kato, matching wits with the underworld and risking his life that criminals and racketeers within the law may feel its weight by the sting. Seth Rogen ("Funny People," "Pineapple Express," "Knocked-Up") stars as Britt Reid, the son and heir to Los Angeles' largest newspaper fortune. He is a rich and spoiled playboy with no direction in life. When his famed newspaper Dad, James Reid, played by Tom Wilkinson ("Michael Clayton") dies, Britt meets an impressive and resourceful company employee. Jay Chou ("The Treasure Hunter") plays kung fu expert Kato, a mechanic and former assistant to Britt's father, who becomes the Green Hornet's valet and sidekick. Together, they realize that they have the resources to do something worthwhile with their lives and team up to become the masked crime fighting team. Kato builds the ultimate weapon, The Black Beauty, an indestructible car, which they use in their fight against crime. Cameron Diaz ("Knight and Day," "Gangs of New York") co-stars as Lenore "Casey" Case, Britt's secretary and love interest of the two crime fighters. Christoph Waltz ("The Inglourious Basterds") portrays Benjamin Chudnofsky, a paranoid Russian gangster and the chief criminal of the city, who has united all the gangs under his power. Also starring are Edward James Olmos ("Beverly Hills Chihuahua") as Mike Axford, managing editor of the Daily Sentinel; David Harbour ("State of Play") as District Attorney Frank Scanlon; Edward Furlong ("Terminator 2: Judgment Day") as Tupper, a meth dealer. James Franco ("Eat, Pray, Love") is making a cameo appearance as the rival drug dealer Danny. Michel Gondry ("Be Kind Rewind," "Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind") directed this film, made famous by the original radio program in the 1930s, starting the adventures of the Green Hornet that carried over in numerous television series, comic books and movies.

"The Green Hornet" is a misguided attempt of a super hero action flick. This one misses the mark. It also certainly is not worth the extra money for the 3-D version which adds nothing to the overall success of the movie.

"SANCTUM" (R)

"Sanctum" is an adventure tale about a deep-sea diving team who get trapped in an underwater cave system. The underwater cave diving team experiences a life threatening crisis during an expedition to the unexplored and least accessible cave system in the world. Richard Roxburgh ("Legends of the Guardians," "Van Helsing") plays Frank McGuire, a master diver, who has explored the South Pacific's Esa-ala Caves for months with a team of expert divers. Rhys Wakefield appears as Frank's estranged 17-year-old son, who is part of the team that also includes playboy Carl Hurley, played by Ioan Gruffudd ("W.") who financed the expedition, and his girlfriend Victoria, played by Alice Parkinson ("Where the Wild Things Are"). Also on the team is Frank's old diving mate George, played by Dan Wyllie ("Animal Kingdom"), and Frank's longtime colleague Luko, played by Cramer Cain. When a tropical storm unleashes its force, the team goes deeper into a cavern, where a flash flood washes of their exit, and the team is forced to drastically alter their plans. With supplies running short, the crew must navigate a complicated underwater labyrinth, fight the raging waters, and control the onset of panic, to find an exit out of the cave. Soon, they must face the possibility of their life or death situation. Alister Grierson directed this underwater adventure, a brainchild of James Cameron ("Titanic," "The Abyss"), who wrote the screenplay and produced the film. The story is based on a true experience by co-writer Andrew Wight. "Sanctum" is a muddled tale presented in unnecessary 3D with a few very special visuals but little suspense or action. Expecting great things from Cameron's involvement, the movie is a disappointing presentation.

This week in Marine Corps History

Feb. 17, 1967

The first full day of Operation Deckhouse VI, which lasted until March 3, was conducted near Quang Ngai City, Vietnam. The special landing force accounted for 280 enemy killed.

Feb. 23, 1945

Four days after the initial landings on Iwo Jima, 1st Lt. Harold G. Schrier led 40 men from Company E, 2nd Battalion, 28th Marines up Mount Suribachi to secure the crest and raise the small American flag that battalion commander, Lt. Col. Chandler Johnson, had given Schrier. Within an hour, the patrol reached the rim of the crater. After a short firefight with Japanese defenders emerging from several caves, the small American flag was attached to an iron pipe and raised over the island.
