Deputy commandant for aviation visits with 2nd MAW leadership

Lt. Gen. Terry G. Robling, the deputy commandant for aviation, visited Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point to discuss past, current and future operations of the 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing March 7-8.

"As the commandant's advisor for aviation, General Robling needs to know his personnel and the capabilities of each command under his charge," said Tim J.

MacKenzie, the 2nd MAW deputy operations officer. "That's what you want in a senior leader, a Marine who takes time out of his schedule to get a feel, to get a flavor of what 2nd MAW is all about."

Robling arrived early March 7 and went straight to business meeting with commanders and senior leaders at the 2nd MAW headquarters. During the meeting, the

Cherry Point removes 4 local business from off-limits list

Four local businesses were removed from the Cherry Point off-limits list recently after they demonstrated that they no longer sell substances recently prohibited to military personnel.

On Monday, Col. Philip Zimmerman, Cherry Point's commanding officer, authorized the removal of Have-lock businesses U.S. Mini-Mart; Expressway, Ltd.; Food Fare; and Merv's Joke Shop in Morehead City from a list that jumped from one to 19 establishments in early February after the commanding general of Marine Corps Installations East ordered the addition of those businesses known to sell the prohibited substances.

Those substances, known under various names including "spice" and "K2," are listed in MCIEAST Bulletin 5800. Since January 2010, their use has been prohibited to military personnel and government civilian employees due to their mind-altering properties, which constitute a danger to the personnel who use them, as well as the personnel they work with. Subsequently, as of March 1, the Drug Enforcement Agency has made them illegal.

Zimmerman's decision was based on the results of a Feb. 28 meeting of the Cherry Point Armed Forces Disciplinary Control Board, which reviewed the cases of the 18 newly added businesses. Four establishments opted to present their cases – to convince the board that they no longer sold the prohibited substances. Based on their testimony, and based on evidence collected by the air station's Criminal Investigation Division, the board provided a recommendation to the commanding officer to remove them from the off-limits list.

His decision was the next step in a series of actions involving the sale of spice.

In January 2010, the commanding general of Marine Corps Forces Command issued an order prohibiting

The casing of the 3rd MAW (Fwd.) battle colors symbolized the transition of aviation operational responsibilities in support of Regional Command Southwest to Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, N.C., based 2nd MAW (Fwd.).

"As I listened this morning to the orders that transferred responsibility from one command to another, I couldn't help but think about what responsibility entails," said Maj. Gen. Richard P. Mills, the commander of Regional Command Southwest. "It's very easy to say it, but a lot tougher to do it."

Mills said after a successful yearlong deployment, he has no doubt 3rd MAW (Fwd.) knows what the word responsibility means, and expressed his confidence in the capabilities of 2nd MAW (Fwd.) in the future.

"This is not a static unit," said O'Donnell. "This unit is constantly changing. You've got to be alert from the day you arrive until the day you leave."

Upon completion of their duties in Afghanistan, 3rd MAW (Fwd.) headquarters will return home to MCAS Miramar, Calif.

"I wish 3rd MAW a safe trip home," said Mills. "Fair winds and following seas."

The uncasing of the 2nd MAW (Fwd.) battle colors symbolized the assumption of responsibility as Regional Command Southwest's aviation combat element in Afghanistan.

"Thank you to 1 MEF and 3rd MAW for setting us up for success," said Walters. "I am honored to have the privilege of leading our Marines into combat. 2nd MAW (Fwd.) will continue to bring the fight to the enemy by doing our most important job, supporting fellow Marines."

MAG-26 soars at EMV

MARINE AIR GROUND COMBAT CENTER TWENTYNINE PALMS, Calif. – Marine Aircraft Group 26 soared into training as the first week of Enhanced Mojave Viper kicked off Feb. 25 at Marine Air Ground Combat Center, Twentynine Palms, Calif. MAG-26 is leading the aviation combat element for the exercise.

Enhanced Mojave Viper is 30-day combined training exercises in which the ACE and ground combat elements integrate operations in preparation for deployment to Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan.

During training days one through three, ACE pilots were given classes and briefed on future flight operations of EMV. Marine Corps Air Station New River's Marine Medium Tiltrotor Squadron 162 took a familiarization flight to get acclimated to flying in the training area.

By training day four, squadrons were off the ground conducting numerous training operations in support of ground units.

The MV-22B Osprey flew high as VMM-162 teamed up with 1st Battalion, 3rd Marine Regiment, to conduct air-ground integration training. Under the training call sign "Oasis," VMM-162 dropped Marines with 1st Bn., 3rd Marines, in a landing zone to set up security measures before raiding a simulated hostile target.

"What we do in relation to what the aviation side does has to be in sync when we conduct raids in Afghanistan," said Cpl. Randy Torrecer, a machine gunner with 1st Bn., 3rd Marines. "We can't make our entrance if the ACE isn't here to fly us in. This is how the war is being fought right now, and this is why EMV is so important."

During the air-ground integration training, the squadron conducted three day landings and three night landings to sharpen its skills.

The next day, other supporting squadrons, flying the UH-1Y Venom (also dubbed the "Super Huey") and

CDC unveils new \$5.2 million facility

Cherry Point families now have less time to wait on getting their children into the Child Development Center thanks to the grand opening of the new CDC building Feb. 28.

"This is a state-of-the-art facility," said LaVerne McKinney, the director of the new CDC building. "The building cost \$5.2 million, which went toward the building and the technology inside the classrooms."

The building is being opened in phases. "With today's opening we are starting phase one," said McKinney. "For phase one there will be 96 kids taken on by our staff of 52 child care providers. After the second phase is complete, it will expand our

current capacity to 292." McKinney said the staff they hire are all put through both individual and group training. "We are always looking for someone who loves kids to help," said McKinney. "After an interview we send them off to training."

The philosophy of the CDC is that a developmentally appropriate program is child centered and enhances the physical, emotional and cognitive development of the child.

"The best part about the opening of the new CDC is there is more space for the children of Cherry Point," said Vera Campbell, the director of Marine and Family Services. "We can now take care of

Patience is a virtue

We live in a microwave society that wants everything done instantaneously, and sometimes, even that is too slow. Our "high speed" internet isn't downloading quickly enough, the trip through the drive through is taking too long, and the instant coffee is just too slow.

If you're anything like my family, we pack our lives with "necessary" activities and then hurry up to get there, only to complain and wonder where all the time has gone. We dream of time when we can relax and allow ourselves to be patient with our current circumstances. The problem arises when decisions present themselves. We tend to react immediately without sitting back and letting them work out.

The other, calmly and patiently moved its legs and kept its head above the cream. World's largest plane touches down at Camp Bastion, Afghanistan

CAMP BASTION, Afghanistan – With its wingspan of 290-feet and a heft totaling 628,000 pounds, the Antonov An-225 dwarfs most other aircraft. But this giant of aviation accomplished a feat that even it would have been incapable of just a few months ago, landing at Camp Bastion, Afghanistan, March 7.

The largest and heaviest aircraft in the world, the one-of-a-kind An-225 is currently operated by Ukraine's Antonov Airlines and contracted to carry large cargo and supplies around the world.

"We fly out of the United Kingdom, Canada, the United States and Germany," said Alexander Klimov, an Antonov Design Bureau flight manager. "But this is our first chance to fly into here."

The aircraft was able to land at Camp Bastion because of the new capabilities of the runway here. The new 11,500-foot flight line at Camp Bastion officially opened in a ceremony Feb. 11. Thanks to the combined effort of Marines, Sailors and local contractors, the goal of the improved runway is to allow the joint camps of Bas-

tion and Leatherneck to receive air traffic from larger aircraft, like the An-225.

"Camp Bastion's flight line just opened up about a month ago for large aircraft," said Maj. Erik B. Eldridge, operational planner with I Marine Expeditionary Force. "Now we are hosts to the largest aircraft in the world."

Though the increased capabilities of the runway will allow larger aircraft like the C-5 Galaxy and Boeing 737 to land and launch from Camp Bastion's runway, members of the Regional Command (Southwest's) aviation community said it also benefits combat operations for 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing (Forward) and its coalition partners.

"We went from a 7,000 to an 11,000-foot runway," said Capt. Jeff Steele, the director of safety and standardization for Marine Aerial Refueler Transport squadrons deployed in support of operations in Afghanistan. "The difference now is it provides for completely unrestricted operations."

The new runway is located adjacent to the previous 7,000-foot runway, which will remain as a functioning part of the flight

line. Steele explained using both the old and new runways allow aircraft to taxi and move about the airfield more efficiently.

"It's as good as any flight line in the world," said Steele. "What they've built

here is a commercial-class airport, without the terminal."

Cherry Point firefighters aid community relations

The constant chatter echoed from the back of the bus to the front of the bus, increasing to a dull roar upon approaching the front gate of Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point.

Approximately 50 kids with the Hilltop Christian School accompanied by a few teachers traveled all the way from Fuquay Varina to visit Cherry Point and receive displays from the Cherry Point aircraft rescue firefighters and the station military working dogs March 11.

The Cherry Point aircraft rescue firefighters have been providing displays for community groups for as long as Chief Warrant Officer 3 Tina M. Burt can remember.

"As long as I have been in, 18 years, I remember school tours and being involved in the surrounding community," said Burt who is the officer in charge of the Cherry Point

aircraft rescue firefighters.

In this past year alone, the firefighters have supported community relations by participating in 19 tours on base and three parades in New Port, Morehead City and Havelock.

"Kids love Marines and they love firefighters," Burt said. "It is something that interests them and it is something that the Marines enjoy doing."

Tracy Wilson, a teacher for Hilltop Christian School, agrees.

"I think the display was awesome and really think the kids appreciated the firefighters and the Marine Corps in general," said Tracy Wilson, a teacher at the Hilltop Christian School. "We hope they continue to support these events for we would love to come back next year."

During the tours, the firefighters usually show off their trucks, going from parts of the trucks to the equipment they

use on the job. They then put their protective suits on which usually creates a reaction from the kids, for the firefighters look like astronauts when all suited up.

The kids ask constant questions about the gear the firefighters use and on most occasions stump the Marines giving the presentation.

"To see the admiration on the kid's faces is the most rewarding aspect," Burt added.

The firefighters also, depending on the weather shoot water from the bumper and roof turrets of the P-19 firetruck, providing the visitors with a real sight of what they do.

The Cherry Point aircraft rescue firefighters plan to keep supporting the community in the upcoming year and following years to come, added Burt.

Cherry Point revisits women's history

After Dec. 7, 1941, a shocked country began gearing up for war. Every military service expanded its recruitment quotas, and thousands of young men flooded recruiting offices around the country to join the fight against the Japanese and German aggressors. They were sent to boot camp, given a little training and a rifle, and sent to the front.


As millions of military-aged men left for war, a void was created on the home front – thousands of manufacturing jobs vital for building the tanks and airplanes that would take America to final victory. Women left behind traditional roles as housewives to join in the war effort.

The U.S. War Department felt this was not enough. To defeat both the German war machine and the fanatical Japanese Imperial forces, America would have to muster every fighting man. To do that, the women of the country would have to take over as many noncombat-related jobs as possible.

The Army created its WAC (Women's Army Corps), the Navy had WAVES (Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service), and the Coast Guard introduced the SPARS (U.S. Coast Guard Women's Reserve). Soon the Marine Corps followed suit by creating the Marine Corps Women's Reserve in 1943.

The 19th Amendment granted women the right to vote with its passage in 1920, but large strides for equality had yet to be accomplished. Mass female involvement in the workplace and military during World War II would empower the women of the country to move forward toward equal ground with men when competing for employment.

To celebrate Women's History Month, the Joint Public Affairs Office received permission to reprint an article about women Marines aboard MCAS Cherry Point published by LIFE Magazine on March 27, 1944. An original copy of the March 27, 1944, issue was generously donated by retired Army Col. David S. Grieshop.

Torn from the pages of LIFE Magazine, March 27, 1944

Last month the Women Marines concluded their first year of service in this war. In that year they had created a full division of fighting Marines by replacing men in noncombatant jobs within the continental U. S. In the same time they had acquired much of the professional discipline and the touchy pride which has always made the Marine Corps a little different from the other services.

Like the WAVES, WACs and SPARs, the Women Marines do nearly everything they have the technical skill and strength to do. Mainly they work in offices, in laboratories and on the ground at Marine air stations. Unlike other servicewomen, they have enlisted in numbers even greater than expected. A year ago, the recruiting goal of the Women Marines was 1,000 officers and 18,000 enlisted women by July of this year. Since they have already surpassed all intermediate quotas, there is little likelihood that they will fall short of this number.

The name of the Women Marines has been less

consciously designed for abbreviation than the name of other women's services, both British and American. They have sometimes been called Lady Leathernecks, Shemarines or Femarines, but none of these names has become common usage. General Thomas Holcomb, retired commandant of the Marine Corps, recently explained this. Said General Holcomb: "They are Marines. They don't have a nickname and they don't need one. They get their basic training in a Marine atmosphere at a Marine post. They inherit the traditions of the Marines. They are Marines."

Of the Women Marines' first 19,000, 8,000 have already been allotted to the Marine division of Aviation. At air bases, where large numbers of ground crewman are needed to take care of the immense detail of handling planes, they have been able to release the greatest number of men for active duty. Aniston and Sandler have an easy going chemistry which works for this run-of-the-mill little comedy.

"THE ADJUSTMENT BUREAU" (PG-13)

"The Adjustment Bureau" is a romantic fantasy thriller about a politician determined to outsmart secret agents trying to control his fate.

Matt Damon ("True Grit," "Invictus," "Hereafter") stars as David Norris, an ambitious politician, who is on the brink of winning a seat in the U.S. Senate.

Emily Blunt ("The Wolfman," "The Young Victoria," "Dan in Real Life") stars as Elise Sellas, a beautiful ballet dancer who gets tangled up with him.

The two strangers meet by chance at the end of David's worst day, his political defeat, when he falls hard for Elise, a kind of woman he had never met before.

When mysterious men conspire to keep the two lovers apart, David learns that he is up against the agents of fate, men of the Adjustment Bureau.

Because both of them are destined for greater things, the bureau will do everything in their power to prevent David and Elise from being together.

In the face of overwhelming odds, David must either let her go and accept his pre-determined path, or risk everything to defy Fate and be with her.

Co-starring is Anthony Mackie ("The Hurt Locker") as Harry Mitchell, the agent assigned to the pair, and the only one from The Adjustment Bureau, who feels any kind of compassion for the couple and is helping the lovers to fight their fate.

Also co-starring is John Slattery ("Iron Man 2") as Richardson, the leader of the fellows with fedoras who shadow the pair; Michael Kelly ("Law Abiding Citizen") as Charlie Traynor; and Shohreh Aghdashloo ("House of Sand and Fog") as Mrs. Norris.

Terence Stamp appears as Thompson, a veteran enforcer and the big guy from "upstairs" known as "The Hammer."

George J. Nolfi, who also wrote the screenplay and produced the film, is making his directing debut with this rather quirky and paranoid feature containing philosophical low tech sci-fi elements, proving that love is a powerful force.

This is the eleventh film based on work by Philip K. Dick ("Minority Report," "Paycheck," "Blade Runner").

"The Adjustment Bureau" is an unconventionally and old-fashioned movie where mysterious forces are keeping two lovers apart.

The chemistry between Blunt and Damon is charismatic and makes the movie worthwhile.

The delightfully offbeat and at times humorous romantic thriller is a stimulating tale, with several plot twists and great chase sequences through an alternative looking New York where most of the action takes place.

"RANGO" (PG)

"Rango" is an animated tale of a chameleon with an identity crisis. Johnny Depp ("Alice in Wonderland") lends his voice to Rango, a reptile and the title character of this cute tale.

Rango is a neurotic but lovable lizard with beady eyes who loves to wear Hawaiian shirts and aspires to be a swashbuckling hero.

When he finds himself in an old Western town inhabited by various desert critters and plagued by bandits, he poses as a lawman, trying his best to fit in with his surroundings.

Rango soon is forced to literally play the role in order to become the town's hero. This production also features the voices of the following actors: Isla Fisher ("Horton Hears a Who") as Beans, Rango's love interest; Abigail Breslin ("Little Miss Sunshine") as Priscilla, an obsessed rodent; Bill Nighy ("Astro Boy") as the villain, Rattlesnake Jake; Alfred Molina ("Spider Man") as Roadkill, an armadillo; Timothy Olyphant ("The Czeries") as The Spirit of the West; Ray Winstone ("Edge of Darkness") as Bad Bill; Harry Dean Stanton ("Alpha Dog") as Pappy; and Ned Beatty ("Toy Story 3") as the tortoise Mayor, who rules the desert town called Dirt.

There is also a Greek chorus, a mariachi band of singing owls that is lending a hand in making this movie a delight.

Filmmaker Gore Verbinski ("Pirates of the Caribbean") wrote, produced and directed this computer animated comedy and enlisted a strong and talented vocal cast with Depp as a standout.

The film was shot like a live-action feature that was later animated with special effects by the Industrial Light & Magic Company.

"Rango" is a cute animated tale set in the Old West where a lizard fights outlaws.

This week in Marine Corps History

March 17, 1967

The first woman Marine to report to Vietnam for duty, Master Sgt. Barbara J. Dulinsky, began her 18-hour flight to Bien Hoa, 30 miles north of Saigon. Dulinsky and the other officer and enlisted Women Marines who followed were assigned to the Military Assistance Command, Vietnam based in Saigon. Most worked with the Marine Corps personnel section providing administrative support to Marines assigned as far north as the Vietnamese Demilitarized Zone, but two lieutenant colonels, Ruth Reinholz and Ruth O'Holleran, served as historians with the Military History Branch, Secretary Joint Staff, MACV.

'The Fords are back'

Ford teams make good showing early on; Roush credits shop

Among the trends that have emerged after the first three races of the 2011 Sprint Cup season is the strength of the Ford contingent.

Rookie Trevor Bayne drove the Wood Brothers' Ford to victory in the season-opening Daytona 500. Chevrolet-driving Jeff Gordon won the second race at Phoenix, but Carl Edwards and his No. 99 Ford roared back at Las Vegas to get his third win in the past five races dating back to the final two events of 2010.

Edwards finished second to Bayne at Daytona and won the pole at Phoenix, where he led 21 laps before being involved in a crash with Kyle Busch.

Edwards said after winning at Las Vegas that his job has been made a lot easier because of the hard work going on back at the Roush Fenway Racing shops in Concord, N.C., where his cars are prepared.

"It's just a joy to drive these race cars right now..." he said. "The Fords are back, and we're strong. That's due to a lot of work from [team owner Jack Roush and crew chief Bob Osborne] and the guys back at the shop, [team manager] Robbie Reiser. Everyone has worked really well together, and it's just great to drive these race cars."

Roush agrees that the latest string of success has its roots back at the shop.

"The team worked especially hard over the winter on things that they recognized had been strengths," he said. "They tried to make those stronger. And things that were lacking a little bit, they worked extra hard to try to correct those deficiencies."

"Right now as I look at our program — except for the judgments that we'd make and for somebody that falls down and for running over pieces of debris on the race track — our Fords have never run better, and I can't wait to see how this year unfolds, so I'm really excited to see what we have in front of us."

This season marks Edwards' best start since 2008, when he won a series-leading nine Cup races and finished second in the standings.

He said he considers himself a better driver now than he was in '08.

"The biggest difference between then and now from my perspective is... I feel like I have a better understanding of how the sport works. And I think that I'm more prepared to use these fast race cars and do a better job to try to win this championship," he said. "It's something that Jack and I have talked a lot about over the years. There is definitely a process to becoming the best you can be at this level because all the guys are so savvy."

"So I feel like I'm in a better position now than I was three years ago to get all the points we can and all the wins we can this year."

Next up for Edwards and the Sprint Cup Series is this weekend's Jeff Byrd 500 at Bristol Motor Speedway.

"That's going to be a wild race, it always is," Edwards said. "But I believe for the reasons we were good at Phoenix, I think we'll be pretty good at Bristol. But you never really know."

"We've won two races there, so we've had good runs, but we've had terrible days there, too, but I think everyone goes to Bristol and just hopes they have a good points day and have a chance to win."

Busch makes drag race debut

NASCAR driver Kurt Busch had an impressive debut in the NHRA's Pro Stock division, even though he lost in the first round of eliminations at the Gatornationals in Gainesville, Fla.

Busch, driving a Dodge Avenger, qualified 12th, an accomplishment in itself for his first professional drag race. But he lost a close race with Erica Enders.

He was a little slower than Enders leaving the starting line and was unable to make up the difference.

His reaction time of .049 seconds was a tick slower than Enders' .021, but his elapsed time of 6.541 seconds was almost the same as Enders' 6.538. His top speed was 211.59 miles per hour; hers was 211.69.

"It was the best graph we've put together in all of our testing, in all of our rounds here in Gainesville," Busch told reporters. "We hit all the shift marks. We just came up short."

He said coming up short in drag racing — he came up about 10 feet short at the finish line — isn't quite the same as it is in NASCAR.

"What's amazing is just three hundredths of a second in this game of drag racing puts you back in the trailer," he said. "This is a tough sport. I have much more respect after showing up in Gainesville and doing all the test runs."

"I wish I had more time to do NHRA racing. This is a lot of fun."

Another Truck win for Kahne

Considering his personal record in the Camping World Truck Series, Kasey Kahne might want to think about competing more often.

Kahne drove a Toyota owned by fellow Sprint Cup driver Kyle Busch to victory last Saturday at Darlington Raceway. It was his second truck win at Darlington in two truck starts and his third in the series in just four career starts. He finished second to Elliott Sadler at Pocono in the one race he didn't win.

At Darlington, Kahne led 95 of 147 laps and held off Todd Bodine and Ron Hornaday Jr. at the finish to seal the win.

"I came here this weekend wanting to win... that was the plan," Kahne said in his winner's interview, adding that he had to work hard for the victory in the closing laps. "This is a tough series. These guys do an awesome job, and that restart there with Todd [Bodine]... our truck was really good once I could get rolling. He tried to get me all the way up to the wall and I think he got himself loose by trying to squish me into the wall. We had a good run down the back and some good laps after that."

Kahne and others noted that there was a surprisingly strong crowd at Darlington for a stand-alone truck race. The official estimate was 20,000 fans.

"The crowd here was great tonight," Kahne said. "It was a lot of fun to race in front of such a good crowd. I love Darlington. This is an awesome race track."

2011 season off to 'dynamic start,' says France

NASCAR chairman Brian France offered an early season update on the state of the sport during a teleconference last week, telling reporters that the Sprint Cup Series is off to a strong start.


He said the 2011 season started "with a very dynamic Daytona 500, having a really young star born, having the iconic 21 Wood Brothers team in Victory Lane, with 74 lead changes, very interesting way the competition played out during the Daytona 500."

From there it was on to Phoenix, where Jeff Gordon broke a 66-race winless streak and another record was set for lead changes, along with improved attendance and TV ratings compared to last year.

"Obviously, the competition has never been better," France said. "That's been brewing in terms of going in the right direction for a number of months, dating back well into last year where, as you know, we made a number of changes in the new car, which is not a new car anymore, but to get the car racing as good as we possibly can."

But France didn't try to say that everything was rosy again.

"There are still some challenges for us and for many, many sports, many companies with still an uncertain outlook for the economy," he

said. "As we said all along, we're not economists, we're not building around a doom-and-gloom, robust economy, we're doing what we think we need to do in general terms."

One issue hanging over the sport is rising fuel prices, which could impact attendance, since a great many race fans drive to races.

"Obviously fuel prices are never helpful to our fans or anybody who needs to drive to an event, or anywhere," France said. "So those things are always out there."

It was pointed out to France that while early season ratings are up

substantially over last year, they're not that much different from 2009.

"I've always said ratings are a function of many things: the competition, how you're viewed at the time by the fan base in a given moment, how the actual race is playing out," he said. "There are all kinds of things that go into it."

"No one around here is celebrating. We're obviously pleased we're up dramatically in our ratings, but we know that is an ebb-and-flow thing. We're focused on a lot of things that will give us growth down the road. We're going to work on those, not get too excited or too down."

France also weighed in on one of the initiatives close to his heart — the sport's diversity program.

"We've had to change the program to maximize it," he said. "We've ended up partnering up with Revolution Racing, which has given some of these talented, diverse drivers a better opportunity to show their skills. It's not just giving them the opportunity, it's giving them the right opportunity."

"I will tell you Darrell Wallace is a young African-American driver that's winning. He's doing that now."

"We're going to have a breakthrough in that area. It's going to be on my watch, and I'll be very proud of that when that occurs."
