## VMAQ-2 Marines receive accolades for safety standards

The motto, "Mission first, safety always – all day, every day" is a commonly known phrase, but for Marine Tactical Electronic Warfare Squadron 2 the motto is paramount to each Marine in the squadron.

The "Death Jesters" of VMAQ-2, 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing, first received accolades for their safety standards July 7, when the honorable Ray Mabus, secretary of the Navy, presented VMAQ-2 with the Secretary of the Navy 2011 Safety Excellence Award for 2011.

Mabus recognized only 19 commands from the entire Navy and Marine Corps for their work, and VMAQ-2 was one of three units in the Marine Corps that was recognized.

"Safety and risk management are intrinsic to effectively prepare for and complete our mission, whether at home or deployed in harm's way," said Mabus. "What you have accomplished in the last year is proof-positive of your mission first, safety always command culture and your commitment to each other, to safety excellence, to the nation, and to the advent of the Department of the Navy as a world class safety organization."

In addition to the Secretary of the Navy's Safety Excellence Award, the "Death Jesters" were awarded the 2010 Naval Aviation Safety Award July 20, for their outstanding safety record during aircraft operations in the U.S. Marine Corps Forces Command.

"The quality or condition of being safe; freedom from danger, injury or damage," reads the



Marine aviator pilots second F-35 Lightning II to joint strike fighter's new Eglin Air Force Base home

## Station leaders remind military, civilians to dress appropriately

The hotter it gets, the less clothes people seem to wear. Regardless of the heat over the summer months, Marines and Sailors have orders regulating their style of dress which can be enforced through disciplinary action.

According to Air Station Order 1020.3E, it defines appropriate civilian attire as meeting "common sense standards of safety, decency, neatness and cleanliness."

Inappropriate attire is defined as "torn, ripped, ragged, excessively dirty, revealing or closely related with drugs, extremist/racist groups or other illegal activities." Other unauthorized clothing is described as obscene, suggestive, anti-military, or cut-off. Revealing clothes and undergarments are also not permitted.

"(Civilian attire) should be professional and conservative in nature," said Gunnery Sgt. Don Ketcham, acting first sergeant of Military Police Company. "It should present a neat and orderly appearance. If a Marine has doubts about it being appropriate, then it probably isn't."

While there are a few items that are never acceptable under any circumstance, most articles of clothing are permitted given they are being worn in the proper environment. Swim gear can be worn at the pool or beach, but is not appropriate for the any place of business.

Tank tops are also allowed at beaches and can be worn during exercise, but are not considered suitable for

business establishments on or off the air station.

The general guidance, according to Marine Corps Order P1020.34G, paragraph 1005, is civilian attire should reflect the service "C" uniform. A buttoned-up collared shirt and slacks are not necessary, but whatever is worn should look similar in decency. A belt must be worn with trousers possessing belt loops and the waist of the trousers will not hang below the wearer's waist.

Establishments like the MCX, the Commissary, the station movie theater and any institution that provides any form of service can deny service to improperly dressed Marines, Sailors or civilians. For service members who fail to adhere to rules of dress can be prosecution under article 92 of the Uniform Code of Military Justice and/or refused service.

"If you see something wrong as a Marine, correct it. It's that simple," said Lt. Col. Eric Weissberger, executive officer of Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point. "It could be from the noncommissioned officer mentorship to the staff NCO or the officer. If something is out place, make a correction."

Marine Corps Order P1020.34G, paragraph 1005 states, "Marines are readily identified with the Marine Corps in and out of uniform, when on or off duty. Therefore, when civilian clothing is worn, Marines will ensure that their dress and personal appearance are conservative and commensurate with the high standards traditionally associated with the Marine Corps."

"Whether or not any of us want to admit it, we're on duty 24/7," said Weissberger. "While that's something that may be more reinforced aboard the air station, we're also good stewards to the local community. If someone looks like a bag of trash in the local community, they're still a Marine and it's up to fellow Marines to let them know that it's inappropriate."

## Harvest HAWK weapons system adds offensive edge

For decades, Marine Aerial Refueler Transport Squadron 252's KC-130s have served the 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing's logistical needs.

The squadron has begun to employ a new system, the Harvest Hercules Airborne Weapons Kit, giving VMGR-252 a new role in the fight it has always supported.

Beginning last October, VMGR-352, 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing, accepted, tested and fielded the Marine Corps' first Harvest HAWK platform in combat. VMGR-252's detachment in Afghanistan

has employed the Harvest HAWK since January and continues its operations today. VMGR-252 accepted its first permanently assigned Harvest HAWK aircraft aboard Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point in June.

"The Harvest Hawk has a special mission kit on board the aircraft that provides it with the capability to deliver ordnance, specifically the Hellfire and the Griffin precision guided munitions," said Lt. Col. Charles J. Moses, commanding officer of VMGR-252. "A normal C-130 doesn't have the capability to conduct the

## Osprey pilots test capabilities during high-altitude exercise

PALMS, Calif. – Pilots of the MV-22

Osprey from Marine Medium Tiltrotor Squadron 365, 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing, based out of Marine Corps Air Station New River, N.C., are ready for the mountains of Afghanistan, thanks to a local skiing hot spot.

Several Ospreys flew in to the Big Bear Airport, in Big Bear, Calif., July 25 and 26, for high-altitude training unmatched by even the expansive Combat

Center training areas. The area's surface elevation hits above 6,700 feet, more than 4,500 feet higher than any landing zone the Combat Center can offer.

It is vital for pilots to train for the higher altitudes because they offer a different set of challenges than the pilots regularly encounter, said Capt. Aaron Huffman, one of the MV-22 Osprey pilots who took advantage of the exercise.

"The Ospreys handle a lot differently," added Capt. Neil Saaiman, one of the VMM-365 pilots who flew with Huffman.

# Chaplain: Leadership

I recently came across a story about Army Gen. Norman Schwarzkopf during my leisure reading time that I would like to share. This story can be found in the book entitled, "It Doesn't Take a Hero," by Schwarzkopf and Petre. When Schwarzkopf arrived to take command of his battalion in Vietnam, the outgoing battalion commander met with him to brief him. What follows is how Schwarzkopf recalls the meeting.

"Come back to my hooch," he said. "I need to talk to you a little."

We drove about a mile to the battalion base camp, which was at the bottom of a hill, and walked to a little cabin halfway up the hillside. On the table sat a bottle of Johnnie Walker Black Label scotch.

"This is for you," he said. "You're going to need it."

I was expecting a two- or three-hour discussion about the battalion, its officers, its non-commissioned officers, its mission – but he only said, "Well, I hope you do better than I did. I tried to lead as best I could, but this is a lousy battalion. It's got lousy morale. It's got a lousy mission. Good luck to you."

With that he shook my hand and walked out.

I am of the opinion that a good leader would not have called his battalion lousy. He would have made it better. He would not have accused his troops of lousy morale. He would have done what was necessary to improve their morale. Neither would he have complained about the mission. He would have done everything to accomplish and even enlarge the mission. This person pointed the finger of blame at everyone and everything but himself. Is it really any wonder that he failed?

You might be saying, "Chaps where are going with this?" Well first of all, I want to give encouragement to those of you who have leadership positions and feel like

the battalion commander that was briefing his incoming relief. Then, I want to give you some free chaplain advice.

I am told good leaders don't make excuses. They are not blind or unrealistic concerning the challenges they face. They are not discouraged by those challenges. They are confident that the problems they face can be solved. They are capable of maintaining a positive attitude. Also, great leaders don't blame their people for not being where they ought to be; they take their people from where they are to where they need to be. Above all, great leaders never lose faith that all this is possible. I know you can be a good leader and even a great one if you will follow these five principles. Now realize these are coming from a chaplain and they will have a religious base.

1. Leaders pray.
2. Leaders work hard.
3. Leaders communicate.
4. Leaders serve.
5. Leaders maintain positive attitudes.

When leaders become cynical, critical or pessimistic, they need to evaluate the causes of such behavior. Whatever the reason, a wise leader will recognize these attitudes and behaviors are unhealthy for the leader and the organization.

Here's where the chaplain part really kicks in. These attitudes and behaviors can be symptoms of an unhealthy relationship with God. Many leaders will spend a lot of time seeking the world's advice on how to manage their organization or command, but give little time to consider the wisdom found in God's word. Some leaders get so

# Marines witness endings, beginnings at close of a career

**CAMP LEATHERNECK, Afghanistan** — In 1986, when Col. Mary Jo MacGregor was commissioned, women represented only four percent of U.S. Marines.

"I'm on my third combat deployment, which was unthinkable early in my career," said MacGregor, chief of staff for 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing (Forward) and a Waukesha, Wis., native. "There were a lot of restrictions on the type of units we could be in and the types of jobs we could be in."

Today, women are able to serve in more than 90 percent of military occupational specialties in the Marine Corps.

Units such as female engagement teams, which serve alongside infantry units providing a link between Afghanistan's women and the NATO International Security Assistance Force troops, spotlight the progress female Marines have made.

"I came into the Corps at a time when there were so many opportunities, and even now we're pushing the envelope on combat arms," said Cpl. Aine Feaser, who served with MacGregor as a Marine Air-Ground Task Force planning specialist with 2nd MAW (Fwd.), and Tampa, Fla., native.

MacGregor and Feaser represent different generations of Marines, but both stand as testament to the ground female Marines have covered since Opha Mae Johnson was the first woman to enlist into the Corps in 1918.

"We collectively have worked so hard to attain those opportunities," said MacGregor, who cited positions women in the Corps now hold, ranging from helicopter pilots to commanding generals.

"The women who came before us worked so hard to open doors that had no doorknobs."

MacGregor, who has 25 years of service, said she has witnessed changes for women in the Marine Corps, and in the mindset of people who decide to become Marines.

"The men and women coming in today are higher quality," said MacGregor. "When you're in an organization that allows people to serve, you're going to have generational differences. If there are generational differences in society, it's going to echo in an all-volunteer force."

"I think younger Marines come in expecting to deploy," said MacGregor. "That is a change from when I first came in during peacetime."

For Feaser, the opportunity to serve her country in a combat zone is a goal she has modeled her career around.

"I had never envisioned myself clearing houses, but whatever was happening, I wanted to be there," said Feaser.

Feaser is one of a number of women who walk the path set by MacGregor and other female Marines. Just as her predecessors did before her, Feaser works to lay the foundation for the next generation of women in the Marine Corps, two of whom she is connected to personally.

On May 17, MacGregor was in Afghanistan, closing a chapter of her military career. Approximately 7,400 miles away at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot in Parris Island, S.C., her daughter, Emily Hall, was writing the opening pages of her Marine Corps story.

Standing alongside Hall in the same boot camp platoon was Feaser's sister, Niamh Cin Oir Feaser.

"She's already in the Corps she'll inherit," said MacGregor of her daughter. "It's not so much I want her to inherit it, I want her to live up to the legacy of the Marines who have gone before her, not just female Marines, but

all Marines."

There is a world to explore for MacGregor, who will soon leave Afghanistan in preparation for her retirement following a quarter century of service to the Corps.

"I plan to see my daughter graduate and join, as she says, 'the family business,' and to meet Feaser's sister," MacGregor said.

MacGregor said she knows that after her service, the Corps is in the capable hands of Cpl. Aine Feaser, and the next generation of Marine leaders.

"She is my daughter's leader. I look at the Cpl. Feasers of the world and I can retire with serenity, because I know my generation's efforts were not in vain, and the Marine Corps is in good hands."



In 2005, the most important things for Christopher Pou and Marc Longoria were for the weekend and memorizing football plays.

Flash forward to 2011 and the most important thing for the duo has become ensuring Marine Attack Squadron 513's sorties in southwestern Afghanistan.

Pou, a sergeant in the Marine Corps, serves as a VMA-513 quality assurance representative and ordnance technician. Longoria, a corporal, is a VMA-513 powerline mechanic. Both are Yuma, Ariz., natives, and both are currently supporting NATO International Security Force Operations in Afghanistan with the Marine Corps Air Station Yuma-based squadron.

The Corps has a long and ongoing history of friends serving together. Pou and Longoria's story begins in 2001 during their freshman year at Yuma High School.

"We met through a mutual friend," said Pou. "We'd walk home together, without knowing that he grew up less than a block away from me."

Pou enlisted in the Marine Corps six months after high school graduation and served with Marine Light Attack Helicopter Squadron 267 in Camp Pendleton, Calif. But distance didn't separate the two.

"Every time I'd come home, we'd see each other at parties," Pou said.

Two years after Pou's enlistment began, Pou and Longoria's families said they made for all of us. Just knowing you have close friends out there, and someone from home, gives you a little more of a push to carry on each day and also a little taste of home."

Both Marines greeted each other correctly and said "Hey! What's up man?" kind of things," Pou said.


Now working in Afghanistan, both agree knowing someone from home helps alleviate the challenges that can come with deployment.
