Subj: SALVAGE OF INERT DEBRIS

Encl: (1) Inert Debris Salvage and Removal Form

1. Situation. This Order establishes procedures for the reuse of salvageable material disposed of at the Land Clearing and Inert Debris (LCID) Landfill.
2. Cancellation. ASO 5090.12
3. Mission. To establish local policy and procedures for the reuse, recycling and reduction of wood, land clearing waste, and inert debris in accordance with applicable state and federal solid waste regulations.
4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent

(1) To properly manage the collection, segregation and disposal of wood, land clearing and inert debris and to allow the recycling and reuse by military and civilian personnel in accordance with applicable state and federal solid waste regulations.

b. Concept of Operations

(1) The Land Clearing and Inert Debris Landfill, located adjacent to Runway 14 L off of Access Road, is a facility permitted by the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (permit #25 -B) to accept inert / non-reactive material. The LCID landfill is open Monday through Friday (0700-1100 and 1215-1530) except holidays. Exception: When Combat Aircraft Loading Area (CAT-A) is being utilized for ordnance handling involving Hazard Class Division (H/ C/D) 1.1 & 1.2 explosives, an Explosive Safety Quantity Distance (ESQD) Arc of 1250 feet must be established. No operations or personnel will be allowed within the arc during HC/D 1.1 or 1.2 explosives evolutions.

(2) Materials that can be reused or recycled at the LCID landfill are as follows:

(a) Land clearing mulch from stumps, trees, limbs, brush, grass, and other naturally occurring vegetative material.

(b) Inert debris (concrete, brick concrete block, uncontaminated soil, gravel and rock, untreated and unpainted wood, and yard debris).

(3) The Facilities Maintenance Department is responsible for daily operations of the landfill and maintenance, repair, and upkeep of the scales. The landfill operator can be contacted at 466-6785. A maintenance operator is present at the landfill's weight scales during hours of operation. During nonoperational hours the access gate will be secured to prevent entrance into the LCID Landfill.

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Coordinate on a daily basis, or when observed activities dictate, with Range Management that ordnance-handling evolutions are terminated prior to opening the landfill. Contact Range Management schedulers at 252-466-4040 or 252-466-4041. The operator's duties include:


- (a) Inspecting waste to ensure that the inert debris is acceptable for disposal at the LCID landfill.
- (b) Weighing and recording descriptions of all inert debris deposited in and removed from the landfill.
- (c) Ensuring that inert debris is placed in designated areas.
- (d) Ensuring that personnel are authorized to remove inert debris from the landfill for reuse.

(4) The Environmental Affairs Department is responsible for permitting, reporting and compliance oversight of the LCID operations.

(5) Personnel wanting to remove inert debris from the LCID landfill must complete the Inert Debris Salvage and Removal Form (enclosure 1). Forms are available at the Environmental Affairs Department, Bldg 4223, and must be renewed annually.

5. Administration and Logistics. Questions pertaining to the content of this Order should be directed to the Environmental Affairs Department.

6. Command and Signal. This Order is applicable to MCAS CHERPT, its subordinate and supported commands.
