

## COMMANDING OFFICER'S STATEMENT ON SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION



Sexual assault is not consistent with the Corps values and will not be tolerated. We will cultivate a respectful climate that is free from sexual assault. Eliminating sexual assault will take a dedicated community effort. Our Marines, Sailors, Civilians and family members deserve nothing less that our complete dedication to this cause. Ignoring or failing to report sexual assault incidents will have damaging consequences for victims and our organization. Where cause exists, appropriate legal or administrative action will be taken against offenders.

Sexual assault is defined as intentional sexual contact characterized by the use of force, threat of force, abuse of authority, or when the victim does not or cannot consent. Sexual Assault is a crime. Marines found guilty of committing sexual assault will be held accountable.

Victims of sexual assault will be treated with sensitivity, decency, and respect. Victims may receive advocacy, medical, legal, and counseling services. Victim identity will be released only to those who have a need to know (i.e., Unit Commander, NCIS). Victim safety is paramount at all times. Victims who choose to make a restricted report in accordance with the reference will have their choice honored to the maximum extent possible. Victims who have the courage to report must feel confident that their personal safety will be protected.

Leaders at all levels will become familiar with the contents of the SAPR Program Order (MCO 1752.5C) and associated reporting requirements, and ensure that all members of their command are briefed on its contents, and receive annual refresher training focused on prevention.

The Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) Program is the agency responsible for providing assistance to victims of sexual assault, guidance to commanders, and assistance for the SAPR Program.
